# **Executive Committee and General Meeting Minutes for January 3rd, 2012**

<u>Executive Committee:</u> Meeting was called to order at 6:50 p.m.by incoming President Walt Cloer. Officers in attendance were Vice President Erv Szego, General Director Henry Smith III, Treasurer Dennis Anderson, Safety Officer Karl Hawley, Photographer Rob Askegaard, and Secretary Ted Broberg.

- A. Status of the field expansion project: Henry III said that there will be no progress at this time. There is some resistance from the neighbors to the move. We have had our Use Agreement renewed, but for only one year, not five as in the past. Henry suggests that we try to get this extended in the future. The Miniature Train people are due for renewal as well, and we might do well to communicate with them. Theirs has in the past been for 25 years at a time. It's Henry's opinion that we still ought to look toward a paved surface for our runway, to mark clearly that this area has a dedicated use. He commented that Jim Ward and Karl have been marking the lines, but that we are not licensed to spray the weeds to keep the field "landable." We've been hiring a licensed contractor approved by the City, at Club expense. Have we a member with such a license? Please contact any club officer.
- B. Walt asked if there were comments about noise lately, and Henry said that has died off. Jim Sonnenmeier mentioned that there were a few comments about noise at the Planning Commission meeting.

<u>General Meeting:</u> Called to order at 7:04 p.m. In attendance were Jim Jones, a second Jim Jones, Larry Koch, Randy Wilbur, Joni Whitsitt, Fox Anderson, Tom Sherwood, Jim Sonnenmeier, Ross Thomas, Jim Hanson, Gary Gough, Art Tinsley, Jeff Greene and two guests, Bob Voss, Mike Fox, Michael Fetyko, John Rittenhouse, David Whittington, Jeff and Ben Zeissner, Roger Nahas, Sven Backlund, John Anderson, William Vincent, Paul Hughes, and Michelle Begen. We welcomed several new members, but I did not catch all their names.


## A. New Business:

- 1. Erv Szego, incoming Vice President, mentioned that as a printer, he's produced a "dummy" (prototype sample) of some Club business cards, which he offers to make these for each member who wishes to have one. He'll print some blank ones for those who wish to put their own information on them. Those interested in his printing card, please send your info to him.
- 2. Jim Sherwood: The helicopter guys and glider guys who can't make it here for a night meeting have asked if we can schedule some of the meetings for Saturdays, at the field. Erv suggests having one every few months there, with plenty of advance publicity. We should find a time that seems to fit the best for the most. Discussion followed. Karl urges us to give it a try. Walt suggests that we meet the first Saturday in April, the seventh, at 10:00 a.m. Moved and passed.
- 3. Swap meet/fun fly: We'll plan tentatively for the second Saturday in May. More info later. -- We'll need a permit from the city.
- 4. Joni Whitsett: April 14-15 will be the **Orange County Youth Expo**, at the County Fairgrounds. In July, at the Fair, she'll have a booth for several days. HSS members helped last year, and she's inviting us to help again this year, in both events. We can showcase our banner and club information. She reminded us that we can gain points toward AMA Gold Leader Club status. We ought also let Costa Mesa City know about our public service.
- 5. PROGRAM: Erv introduced Paul Hughes, one of his co-workers, who is into model rocketry. He's been heavily involved since he was a kid. His dad scratch-built gliders, but Paul never got into it. He scratch-builds, and also does kits. In 1957, Russia launched SPUTNIK, and American kids got into trying to make their own rockets. This led to many injuries and accidents. \_\_\_\_\_ Stein and Orville \_\_\_\_\_ started making black-powder solid-propellant rocket motors, and then began to make kits. They could not keep up with the demand for motors. They got hold of Verne Estes, who was able to make rocket motors at production speeds for volume sales. In 1957, the \_\_\_\_\_ was formed, enabling members to have insurance at a reasonable price. They have local competitions leading to a national event. He's a low-power guy, but some model rockets have passed 19,000 feet, and Mach 3. (Sorry for the omissions. Ed.)

# **Executive Committee and General Meeting Minutes for January 3rd, 2012 (continued)**

- Q-- Roger Nahas: How do you know the altitude? A: I have a program on my computer for thrust and mass, but some of the larger ones carry an altimeter. Paul likes low-power, 1/8 A motors. He showed a few of his models. (See photo below).
- Q--Where do you launch? A: Lucerne dry lake, Santa Fe Dam, Irwindale, and San Diego's "Fiesta Field." He flies a couple of times a month.
- Q-- Sizes? A: Fractional A, up to O, which will power a rocket large enough to get in. (He doesn't recommend it!) G's run about \$30 apiece; You can rearm motors up to a G size without certification, or above that with a license. He's a Black-powder guy; Ammonium perchlorate is used for some of the big ones. Black powder burns slowly, from one end of the fuel pack to the end. Other propellants may go off catastrophically. There is a fine for launching without a permit in Orange County: \$1,000 per flight.
- 6. Show and Tell: (See photos below).
  - a. John Anderson: Antoinette made of cardboard. It flew briefly at the Blimp Hangar in December. He's working on centers of lift and balance, to fine-tune it.
  - b. Henry Smith III: Steven's Aeromodels CIEL FOU (French for "Flying Flea").
  - c. Jim Hanson; QUAD COPTER
- 7. Drawing: The JR transmitter from Don Ramsay was won by Ben Zeissner; new member Mike Fetyko chose the landing gear; the bundle of SLOW STICK props was taken by Rob Askegaard; Jim Hanson chose the SPORT BIPE; Dave Whittington selected the air retracts from Dennis Anderson; and Erv Szego got the multimeter, also from Don Ramsay.

# **HSS** is Now a Gold Leader Club

HSS has just qualified as a Gold Leader Club. We have been a Silver Leader Club since 2009, but through added effort, we have just reached the highest level. The AMA establishes criteria for recognition of charter clubs based upon the following standards.

In order to recognize the leadership of the best model clubs, the Academy has established the AMA Leader Club Awards. These awards can be earned by any AMA chartered club, by meeting certain standards of community service and activity.

There are three levels of AMA Leader Clubs: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Once a club meets the minimum criteria, it qualifies for different levels based on performance.

AMA has established 6 goals (one goal can be waived) and nine electives to obtain Leader Club status. A clubthat meets the required five goals, plus three of the electives, qualifies as a Bronze level Leader Club. Meeting the required five plus six electives qualifies the club for the Silver level. The ultimate recognition, Gold level, requires that all goals be met.

#### When a Club Qualifies for Leader Club Status It Receives:

- A certificate from AMA Headquarters.
- A gold, silver, or bronze finished pin for each current club member in the first year.
- Published recognition in Model Aviation and listing on AMA's Web site: www.modelaircraft.org. Gold Leader Clubs Also Receive:
- An engraved ID plate for the club field bulletin board.
- In the year following the fifth and tenth consecutive year of Gold Leader Club status, each club member will receive a special Five or Ten Year patch.

#### Required Activities for Leader Club Status:

- 1. AMA chartered club for a minimum of five years.
- 2. Club membership is open to all AMA members and is not limited to a certain number.
- 3. Club has developed and posted Safety and Operational Rules at its flying site.
- 4. Club has filed a copy of Safety and Operational Rules at AMA Headquarters.
- 5. Flying field has separate areas for fliers and spectators, clearly marked as such.
- 6. The AMA Safety Code is posted and visible at the club field.

Program Requirement Modification: In order for a deserving club to be considered for Leader Club status, the club's district vice president may waive one of the above requirements for participation.

#### Leader Club Electives:

- 1. Club has implemented and enforces a frequency control plan that allows all 50 RC channels to be used at its club flying site where RC is allowed.
- 2. Club has implemented an AMA Adopt-A-School program or donates a Model Aviation magazine subscription to schools or libraries.
- 3. Club conducts a review of the AMA Safety Code at a club meeting at least once a year.
- 4. Club sponsors an annual public event, such as a mall show, flying show, or demonstration.
- 5. Club monitors noise levels and/or institutes club field rules, such as a requirement that models be operated at a maximum of 90 db at 9 feet.
- 6. Club has created an informational handout and provides it to the general public.
- 7. Club participates in charity programs or public fund-raising events.
- 8. Club has a formal lease or agreement for use of its flying site or owns its site.
- 9. Club participates in the AMA Introductory Pilot Program or has its own instruction program.

Temporary permits are issued at the Downtown Recreation Center (1869 Anaheim Avenue, Costa Mesa 92627) between the hours of 10:00am – 1:00pm on Saturdays. For information, call 714-327-7560.

You do not need to be a Harbor Soaring Society member (but it is good to have you join us).



# A Word by Mike Lee, Inland Soaring Society President

We share newsletters with a number of model clubs in Southern California, one of the best is the Inland Soaring Society in Riverside. The newsletter editor is Annette Dora, and her great work may be observed at <a href="https://www.gglideiss.us">www.gglideiss.us</a>. Their president is Mike Lee who is one of America's pre-eminent model sailplane pilots, having competed nationally and internationally. Mike has been president for about 10 years, and has guided ISS as it grew from a strictly soaring group into the multi-interest club that it is today. This is very similar to the growth seen at Harbor Soaring Society. What is outstanding about ISS is the following excerpt by Mike Lee from his most recent president's message.

Concerning club spirit and tolerance, "especially considering the contribution that our electric pilots make to the club just by being members. Without them, we might not have a runway. We might not have the manpower to put on our contest events. We might not have much of a club at all. I believe we have the best mixed culture of modelers to be found anywhere! Sport flyers, competition pilots, scale lovers, adrenaline junkies, racing, slow flyers, hand launch.....you name it and we have seen them fly from our field."

Mike goes on to close the issue with his end of the year presidential statement.


