Jim Hanson led the meeting at which members attending discussed current status of new permit system being jointly developed with the City of Costa Mesa et al, reasonable weight limits for all aircraft, field rules enforcement, potential liability of club officers for damages and injury, and ways and means of getting "soaring community and electric power flier working together as HSS club members. There were no significant decisions made.

HSS Aviation Class and Radio Control Club

Introductory model building and aviation classes at the Newport Sea Base are a success with over 25 youth enrolled! Thanks to HSS volunteers Jim Hanson, John Anderson and Don Knight; we are building paper and foam gliders, learning basic physics of flight, and learning on flight simulators. AMA Jr. Membership is provided with registration for the class/club, allowing youth to visit the flying field on weekend mornings for "stick time" flying with instructors from the club.

Open to kids age 8 to 18, the next phase of the program is developing intermediate skills by assembling donated ARF and balsa models along with radio and electric power systems. Currently there are 25 kids enrolled.

Class meetings are every Wednesday (except holidays) from 4:30 to 6:30pm. The current session runs through January 31, 2007. A new beginner's session will start February 7. The class/club fee is only \$50 per student.


Jim Ward's C-119 Flight Shot

Directions: Take anything to Coast Highway in Newport Beach. Go East on Coast Highway several blocks East of Newport Blvd. It is adjacent to the UC Irvine/Orange Coast College sailing facility. There is a parking lot in front of the building, and an additional public parking lot a short block up from the corner of Coast Highway and Tustin Avenue (City of Newport not City of Tustin). Some metered parking is also available on Coast Highway. Warning, do not park in business lots such as Ardels or Taco Bell. They have observers to prevent improper parking.



A Work In Progress

Your editor's Cessna 140, a Pat Tritle "short kit" design, is all framed up and I have inlayed 1/16 balsa sheet to beef up the nose and cabin area without adding too much weight. I couldn't resist adding an instrument panel. I added some basswood bracing around the top and sides of the cabin. Pat's is known for extremely light structures intended to fly scale- like and land at walking speed. Expecting occasional cartwheel landings at Fairview, I beefed things up. I intend to cover the fuselage with chrome Monokote scrubbed with Scotchbrite for a realistic aluminum look. Horizon Hobbies/Spektrum verified that chrome Mono won't block Spektrum signals. Wings will be covered with silver Microlite. 1946 C-140's had silver painted rag wings. I am in process of mounting two 4.3 gm servos in wings for ailerons and two HS-55's for rudder and elevator, the rudder will be pull-pull and elevator will be by pushrod.
