

Minutes of the Harbor Soaring Society-October 2, 2008

Club officers present: Jim Hanson, President; Jerry Laux, Newsletter Editor; and John Anderson, General Director.

Business:

NOVEMBER 2008

- 1. Jim Hanson reviewed the HSS board job duties and nominations for the 2009 election. The need for membership support to help with some of the tasks was also discussed.
- 2. Jim also noted the prospect of using the Coco's Restaurant in Costa Mesa as the location of the annual HSS banquet. John Anderson will also evaluate the site for Jim. The room itself is free and should seat 30-36 persons.

- 3. John Anderson showed the plaque honoring the scouts for the frequency board project. John is working with all parties to set a date for a small commemoration ceremony. A discussion followed regarding some details of the board including the type of pin to be used and issues with certain channels such as 53. These items will be permanently resolved later but meanwhile appropriate notes will be posted to clarify the matter.
- 4. John Anderson noted the need to address the container maintenance. A discussion followed regarding various "fixes" and their associated costs. It was agreed that the glider fliers should take a lead role in resolving the matter...ideally before the winter rains.
- 5. A further discussion addressed problems with the pit fencing. Various alternatives were offered. John Anderson is to explore the matter with the City. John is also exploring matching grant opportunities with AMA and the City.

Show and tell:

- 1. Henry Smith displayed his new quarter-scale Great Planes RV-4. His goal was to develop a quarter-scale plane under 10 pounds. In that he was only partially successful as the desired battery (8-cell/ 5000 mHa) would push the weight just above the target. The plane includes landing flaps linked to the elevator (set to provide a little "down" to reduce flap "float"). Henry noted the good structural design, clean laser-cut parts, and detailing including considerable use of blind nuts/bolts instead of just wood screws into plywood. Henry awaits the arrival of his son in town before taking it up for its first flight.
- 2. Jim intended to demonstrate one of his indoor flight capable helicopter; but upon takeoff realized that the battery was not sufficiently charged. Discretion being the better part of valor the meeting was adjourned.


