General Meeting Minutes, Tuesday July 6, 2021.

Unfortunately your secretary and our club photographer were not in attendance, but Don Wittenberg stepped up to assist in taking the following minutes of the meeting. Thanks Don.

President Mike Costello opened the meeting at 7:00 PM.

- Mike Costello reported that the Costa Mesa City Council will conduct a meeting on July 20 at the city hall. Included in the agenda will be a review of our request for a Use Agreement to fly at Fairview Park. As many HSS members as possible should attend to support HSS reopening at Fairview Park. Editor's Note: Subsequent to this announcement, the HSS review has been removed from the agenda. A future meeting will be announced.
- A discussion was held on the possibility of petitioning CM to remove the non-native trees at the bottom
 of the bluff that block the wind that used to create lift for slope flyers. Those trees are dying because
 their roots are deep enough to reach the ground salt water in the water table. That possibility is to be
 kept in mind in the future.
- Henry and Jordan were complemented for their TV interview on Spectrum News with Zack Tawatari.
 For those who haven't seen the news piece, see feature article following these minutes.
- A discussion was held concerning the airfields at which HSS members are now flying since the closure of FVP. These include:

Blackstar: Very noisy on weekends. Crowded too. Not bad on weekdays. \$140? initiation, \$60? annual dues. Very good runway.

Kite Hill, Laguna Niguel: Good slope flying for gliders. Good thermals. Very challenging for powered planes since runway is sloped uphill/downhill, with cross wind. (Henry and Jordan had a midair on the day of the Spectrum interview. Thankfully not on camera.)

El Dorado Park: No real runway. Only rolling grassy knolls. Good lake flying 9:00 to 3:00 weekends only. Enter from Feann? & La Palma.

Whittier Narrows Recreation Park, El Monte: Located up the 605 freeway, east on the Pomona Fwy, off Rosemead Blvd. 45 minutes to one hour of driving from Huntington Beach. Long asphalt runway with no hikers or residents to complain about noise. Some large gas planes but not crowded on weekday mornings.

- Show and Tell:
 - Ted Danson showed his 15" wingspan Messerschmitt? ME109. He modified it from a DUMAS kit, converted from rubber band power to electric in 2005.

- Jordan showed his E-Flite F-16 70 mm EDF. 6 cell battery, 4000 to 6000 mah. He said it's the best-flying jet that he has flown. Very stable. He balanced the fan so that it is relatively quiet.
- Henry showed a balsa wood fuselage that he constructed of a De Havilland Hummingbird from Stevens Aero. Tiny drops of glue at the many joints.



John Anderson works with the California Civil Air Patrol, Aerospace Education program. He recently led a training exercise in San Louis Obispo before 180 cadets. He taught them how to make glider aircraft out of 3 x 5 inch index cards and paper clips. It is an excellent way to engage his students and present a "Rapid Concept" about the basics of airplane design. He showed examples of the many creative gliders that the cadets designed, made, and flew. John showed us storyboards from his presentation. On the following page is one showing record-making model airplanes.

Harbor Soaring Society hopes to fly again in Fairview Park

ORANGE COUNTY, Calif. — From the ground, you can see how these model airplane enthusiasts take pride in getting their remote-control planes wheels up. One enthusiast is Mike Costello, who's been flying models since the 60s and is president of the Costa Mesa-based Harbor Soaring Society.

"My dad was a full-size pilot and flew models before WWII. So it was kind of ingrained...it's just in my DNA," Costello said. "I love airplanes of all kinds. I enjoy being outside. I enjoy the skill it takes to fly one of these."

What You Need To Know

- Harbor Soaring Society has been flying in Fairview Park since the 1960s, but recently the city has been evaluating the flying of planes
- The park has been closed since the pandemic and the city of Costa Mesa and the society are trying to work out a compromise to coexist with endangered species in the area
- · Compromises include remaining on the west side with modified use or moving to the east side of the park
- The city council will vote on a decision on July 20

He and a few of his fellow club members, Henry Smith III and Jordan Lapin, were in Laguna Niguel recently flying their electric park flyers and motorized glider because for over a year flying at their home field, Fairview Park in Costa Mesa, has been grounded.

The club has been flying planes in Fairview since the 60s, but that was before it was even a city park. Recently, the city has been evaluating the flying of planes at this location.

"The pandemic has been brutal because the park has been closed, our regular monthly meeting venue has been closed and in fact is now out of business so now we have a new one," Costello said. "The other challenge has been working out a compromise solution with the city of Costa Mesa to coexist with the endangered species at Fairview Park."

That challenge has been a complex one for the Society and Fairview Park Steering Committee. It's been up to people like Park Administrator Cynthia D'Agosta to balance the needs of the 210-acre park with the needs of residents who want to use its space.

The club's Fly Field is located on the west side of the park. The main problem is that this field sits in the middle of the park's vernal pool complex which is home to two endangered species of fairy shrimp which provide food to migratory birds. There are a total of five endangered plant and animal species, numerous special species and over 130 documented bird species at the park.

"This spot helps drain all that rain into those pools and because we get it so rarely, it is important to preserve that," D'Agosta said pointing to the complex.

D'Agosta says it's not just officials that feel these environmental concerns. It's voters too. They passed Measure AA in 2016 — which further reflects the community's desire to protect Fairview Park. As someone who's worked in park planning for 30 years, she says she understands where they're coming from.

"I resonate, I connect with people who also in their communities appreciate the last little bits of open space that we have left like this," D'Agosta said.

Both sides say they want to find a compromise.

The Harbor Soaring Society is advocating to stay put on the west side with modified use; like the hours and days they can fly. The other option is building a new runway and relocating to the park's east side. Costello and club haven't landed on that idea just yet.

"Do I think it's possible? Yeah I think it's possible," Costello said. "Do I think it's the best decision? We don't think so."

The city council vote to determine flying planes in Fairview Park will take place on July 20.

Here's a recent timeline of the Agreement between the city and the club:

- June 25, 2019: the Use Agreement between the city and HSS was approved by City Council on for a one year (1) period, ending June 30, 2020
- In approving the Agreement, the City Council directed staff to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the value of the partnership between HSS and the city, and to assess the compatibility of all flying activity with the Master Plan for Fairview Park and Measure AA, as recommended by the Fairview Park Steering Committee (FVP SC) and the Parks, Arts and Community Services Commission (PACS), within a one-year period (July 2019-June 2020)
- March 2020: the evaluation report was completed and presented the night before COVID shut down the park and fly field.
- June 2020: the city council extended the agreement till December 2020 with the stipulation that HSS present a proposal in September; field/park remained closed
- February and May of 2021: the HSS Proposal is taken up again by FVP Steering Committee and Parks Commission with recommendations for modifications to the field and potential to investigate moving the fly field to another area of the park
- July 2021: the city council will consider a new agreement, new rules and possible re-location of the fly field. Note: This has been cancelled. Ed.

Watch out for TRUST Scams (From AMA)

AMA has been approved to administer The Recreational UAS Safety Test (TRUST). AMA has worked closely with the FAA to ensure that TRUST meets the intent of Congress without placing an undue burden on our hobby community. TRUST is free to take, so be cautious of any site that has a fee associated with taking the exam. Additionally, some sites might offer to send you a laminated copy of your TRUST completion certificate for a fee. There is no requirement to purchase these cards. There is no set deadline to take TRUST, but the FAA recommends taking the test as soon as practical.

We were supposed to be a topic of conversation for the July 20 City Council meeting, but we got bumped off the agenda. No word yet on when this might be rescheduled, but we'll get the word out to you. When the time comes, we need you to show up and support your club.

Henry, Jordan, and I met with Zack Tawatari from Spectrum News down at Kite Hill to be interviewed for TV news. Zack also met with Cynthia at Fairview Park. I think Zack did a good job with the story, and presented a balanced view of the situation in the park. Henry & Jordan also met Zack at the crack of dawn to be filmed once per hour for their morning news show. Thanks, Henry & Jordan, for getting up before the sun to give HSS some good publicity! 






War Birds and Scale Fly-in.




