- 1. The meeting was called to order by President John Rittenhouse.. Officers in attendance included Vice president Henry Smith III, Treasurer Jim Hanson, and General Director John Anderson.
- 2. Members in attendance was not tabulated.
- 3. John R. conducted the pledge of allegiance.
- 4. A discussion of the up-coming TAG Open House event was held.
- 4.1. Jim Hanson has committed to putting a notice on the kiosk.
- 4.2. John Rittenhouse obtained the city permit for the event, and put a notice on the HSS Facebook page.
- 4.3. John Anderson committed to having the CAP assist in providing the manpower for the event
- 5. Jim Hanson has been very diligent about recording activity surveys out at the field. His work has been a godsend for the club.
- 6. John Anderson has been following up some leads generated by the club website, he attended the most recent status meeting on Mile Square. John also presented two ideas on how to solicit more members.
- 7. Henry has continued mowing the field. Henry is in the process of talking to Cynthia about allowing the use of the "Weed Eater" line trimmers to remove the stubby shrubs that cannot be cut with the mower.
- 8. Henry has responded to Cynthia (FVP administrator) inquiries regarding some miss information she had received concerning the environmental impacts of our flight operations. Donald Wittenberg also provided some VERY scholarly research regarding some of the assertions.
- 9. John R. continued his ongoing negotiations with the FAA regarding our LOA. During the meeting, John circulated an article published in Aviation Space & Week Technology, that spoke of the FAA's intention to eventually equip all drones (model aircraft?) with transponders.
- 10. Jim was the guest speaker for the night. He spoke about his drone flights, and narrated two drone videos.

August 6, 2019, HSS Steering Committee Meeting Minutes.

The logistics of the upcoming "TAG" event were discussed.

On going maintenance of the runway and compliance with City environmental requirements were reviewed.

John Anderson submitted a page of comments that will be addressed in a later meeting.

The Action Topic list was not reviewed. this will be delayed until the August 6 meeting.

Subject to Committee approval. <u>Further Action</u>: An Activity Survey was sent out to all members to vote on proposed activities. Results of this poll was published in July newsletter. Steering Committee did not have time to discuss at 2 July Steering Committee meeting.

- 21. Complete club property inventory for 2019. Who, when? <u>Action:</u> Fred H. volunteered to complete the club property inventory, but completion date is undefined, pending storage container inventory. <u>Conclusion:</u> See Excel spread sheet file titled Preliminary HSS Shed Inventory 2019.xlsx reproduced in HSS Plane Rap newsletter dated June 2019. The final inventory was presented at 2 July Steering Committee meeting. Also see file titled HSS Video Library.doc in the June 2019 newsletter. An inventory of HSS DVDs will be prepared.
- 22. Review Newsletter Archives and Club Documents Inventory already prepared by Fred Hesse.

 <u>Action:</u> Fred Hesse to send documents and files to John Rittenhouse for insertion on to web site.
- **26. On Hold. (May 7) Review** John Anderson's two documents on proposed membership increases. Conclusion: This action topic on hold.
- 27. On Hold. (May 7) Travis Black had been arranging manufacture of club T-shirts.

 <u>Action:</u> John Rittenhouse wishes to procure examples from other clubs. AMA Assistant Vice President Dave Meriwether will try to obtain guidelines.
- 40. Begin planning for TAG Open House. Program to be managed by Fred Hesse with Steering Committee approval of all tasks. Henry will act as event director and apply for city permit.

 <u>Action:</u> Fred Hesse is preparing activity and advertising plans. Preliminary status report to be given to club members at September 3 General Meeting.
- **44. Closed. (June 25)** Steering Committee to review draft Use Permit received from the city. Conclusion: City Council approved one year extension to HSS Use Permit on 25 June 2019.
- 45. John Rittenhouse to prepare Letter of Agreement for SNA air traffic control office. LOA draft sent to AMA for final format and approval.
- **46. Closed. August 6)** A Radian XL was donated to the club. This is a 110" span motor glider not suitable for basic training. Committee to determine what to do with it. (Sell or raffle it off.)

 Conclusion: Radian XL raffled off at August 6 meeting. Won by Rob Askegaard.

FAA and Other Clubs

Your editor trades newsletters with a number of clubs in Southern California. Of particular interest is the following from Silent Electric Flyers of San Diego (SEFSD). Their newsletter titled Peak Charge always opens with comments from their Chairman, Brad. In this case he addresses a number of FAA related activities that are similar to those of HSS.

Our efforts to establish a Letter of Agreement with Lindbergh air traffic control continue. I would like to thank BOD members Quan, Steve, and Eric for their Efforts. Also a big Thank you to Steve Manganelli for his contributions and experience dealing with Government entities. Our LOA was submitted this week and we are waiting for a reply from the officials involved. While this process is underway we have not been instructed to cease operations, so we are still using our site. It is very important that we adhere to the posted guidelines at our site. Please make a STRONG effort to keep aircraft below 400 feet. Some folks have a harder time judging altitude than others - so If you think "I wonder if I am too high?" - You are too high and should not linger. Along these lines, Jeff has also reduced the motor run times for Electroglide to keep the gliders closer to our limits.

Late last month we had an Officer from the FAA visit our site. He was happy we were in talks with the tower, but was very unhappy that less than half of the models (Planes AND Multi-rotors) on site had FAA registration numbers displayed per the current legislation. While neither I nor the BOD members serve as FAA Police, and are not going to be inspecting your craft - I am motivated to state that the FAA requirement to register yourself and display your numbers can get you in hot water legally and the possibility of a hefty fine is not out of the question. 99% of us are grown-ups, Nuff said...

Your editor will continue to monitor the progress of SEFSD particularly since they are using the 400 foot altitude limit and yet are located very close to their major airport. I wonder what percentage of HSS members display their FAA registration numbers.

Passing of Todd McAndrew

We are very sorry to report that Todd McAndrew has passed away. He has been a long time member of Harbor Soaring Society, and an enthusiastic and capable thermal duration glider pilot. FAA Registration Extension

When FAA registration was first required in December 2015, many of our members fulfilled the obligation and obtained their FAA registration, which is valid for three years. As the expiration date printed on the certificate approaches, these members have reached out to us to learn how to renew their FAA registration numbers. If you are a model aircraft owner who registered before December 12, 2017, and did not request to have your registration information deleted from the FAA's database, the FAA has extended the expiration date for you to December 12, 2020.

Take-off And Grow Event Planning

In late January of 2019, your HSS officers submitted an application for a TAG (Take-off And Grow) grant from the AMA Education Department. We are pleased to announce that our submittal was approved, and that we have received a check for \$980 to conduct an open house and update our flight training equipment.

Preliminary planning has started. An event flyer is shown on page 16 of this newsletter. Preliminary event planning is shown below. This outlines some of the activities and club members who have volunteered (or may volunteer) to assist in the event. A lot of preparation is needed, but we have a formal date of 14 September for the open house, and we have a city use permit for the event. We plan to demonstrate winch launched gliders, discus launched gliders, aero tow glider launch, 3D stunt exhibition, motor gliders, scale and multi-motor planes, ducted fan jets, helicopters, drones, free flight rubber powered planes, and build and fly paper gliders. We will offer free flying lessons using the new equipment we will procure, and computer aided flight simulation classes. We are looking for members that would volunteer to demonstrate the various types of aircraft mentioned above. The CAP is expected to participate as arranged by John Anderson.

CAP Activities: To be coordinated by John Anderson.

Uniformed cadets providing information and security, especially on flight line.

Participation in demonstrations. Plane types to be determined. Drones?

Bring cockpit simulator?

Flight Training – Ongoing all day. This is a four stage sequence as follows.

- Stage 1. Ground School. Old Apprentice trainer plane with prop removed. Ted Broberg(?) demonstrates control movement, and illustrates plane change in attitude or position. Emphasizes plane response when flying away vs. flying toward pilot. Explain how radio works, and how altitude telemetry is returned (show altimeter sensor if available).
- Stage 2. Flight Safety. Kevin Koch explains where flying is allowed. Flying precautions. Range check. Preflight preparation, check control linkages, prop, proper control movement. Takeoff into the wind., vocal calls for takeoff and landing.. Altitude limits. Note trainers have altimeters. Discuss Li-Po battery precautions, fire extinguisher, sand bucket.

- Stage 3. Flight Simulation. One or possibly two flight simulators to be operating. Ralph Siegfreid using HSS lap top with new RealFlight V8.0, and Fred H. using his personal lap top with RealFlight V5.5 doing training. AC extension cord needed from kiosk charging station. Consider setting up HSS large screen TV.
- Stage 4. Flight School. Henry Smith gives flight training with new Apprentice. Maybe Chris Adamczyk using a large glider or new Radian. Second (old) Apprentice used by Ted Broberg at Stage 1.

Build and Fly Paper Gliders (if featured):

John Anderson to manage this operation. May need to bring extra table.

Literature Handouts at refreshment table managed by Marge Hesse.

HSS Tri-fold brochure.

Simulator Station: One or two RealFlight simulators set up at <u>westernmost picnic table in pit area.</u> Laptop computer(s) powered by AC extension cord from kiosk. Pop-up shade covering needed. Dark blankets or equivalent hanging from edges to eliminate reflection on video screens. Possibly use large (42") club flat screen TV. Managed by Ralph Siegfreid?/Fred H.

Refreshments Station: <u>One of center picnic tables in pit area</u>. Managed by Marge. Pop-up shade cover required. Cookies and bottled water for guests. First Aid kit, and literature hand-outs. If tablecloth desired, bring tape to secure it. Maybe bring ice chest.

Flight Safety Station: Managed by Kevin Koch <u>on one of center picnic tables in pit area</u>. Support equipment to be determined. Use flying area map. Discuss fire extinguisher. Demonstrate range check process.

Ground School Station: Managed by Ted Broberg on the <u>Easternmost picnic table inside pit area</u>. Requires a trainer plane and radio (old Apprentice?). Possibly use battery powered mechanical flight demonstrators. this table also used for demonstration flight staging area.

Static Display Area: Managed by Chuck Herrington and Jesse Calleros. Uses <u>Eastern picnic table</u> <u>outside pit area</u>. Use dirt beside path for additional space as needed. May use this table for staging demonstration flights. Additional pop-up shade covering needed. V.P. Raghavan(?) owner of 6 ft giant scale helicopter will only bring it if shade is available.

Build and Fly Paper Gliders: John Anderson to manage this operation. May need to bring extra table, or squeeze onto another picnic table.

Ground photography will be by Rob Askegaard. Aerial photography TBD?

Someone needed part time in parking lots (Canyon lot, and Fairview lot) directing parking and visitors.

Preparation Activities Scheduled for Friday 13 Sept



2019 City Flying Permits Available

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$50 per year for Costa Mesa residents. \$55 for nonresidents, plus \$5 Administration fee.. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$TBD per year.

MAIL-IN Mail your renewal packet (see list below), to include full payment, to:

City of Costa Mesa, P. O. Box 1200, Costa Mesa, CA 92628

Renewal Packet must include ALL of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- Copy of your driver's license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year), or home owner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500.000).
- Renewal Fee payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.
