March 5, 2019 General Meeting Minutes

The 5 March 2019 HSS General Meeting was held at the Round Table Pizza restaurant in Costa Mesa. The meeting was called to order by President John Rittenhouse at 7 PM. In attendance were Vice President Henry Smith III, Treasurer Jim Hanson, General Director John Anderson, and Secretary/Editor Fred Hesse. Members and guests in attendance are listed below.

- 1. John R. conducted the Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2. Jim Hanson introduced Kevin Koch as our Safety Coordinator, and Sid Hood as our Field Maintenance Manager.
- 3. John R. said that field maintenance will be postponed due to rain.
- 4. John talked with Dave Lapin as a possible web/social media manager. See following meeting notes below.
- 5. John introduced Kurt Young from Black Sheep Squadron who is our guest speaker for the evening as part of a speaker exchange program that was recently initiated.
- 6. Kurt Young gave an excellent presentation about owning and flying a Ryan Navion (full size) aircraft. Kurt had slides and video clips of his beautiful Navion, and a lot of historical information about the plane and its service in the military. Included were some great photos of formation flying, and his participation in the EAA "Young Eagles" program where he gave free flying experience to high school aged kids. Kurt responded to questions at the conclusion.
- 7. Next, John introduced Dave Gee who is President of Black Sheep Squadron. Dave gave an informal presentation on the Black Sheep Squadron.
- 8. We were pleased to have past HSS President Joni Whitsitt, who gave a discussion about the upcoming Imaginology event at the Orange County Fairgrounds. It is a three day event on April 12-14, and Joni commented that the aviation part of the event is the most popular. HSS will team with the CAP, Orange Coast College aviation department, and possibly the Knights of the Round Circle (a Ucontrol club). HSS will bring models for static display, indoor gliders and electric and rubber powered models for flight inside the fair facility called the "Hangar". John Anderson will conduct his build and fly paper glider construction class, and we will have a large screen TV showing a model flight simulation program. CAP will bring a cockpit simulator, and Orange Coast College will bring one or two flight simulators for full size aircraft. The show is open Friday April 12 from 9 AM to 3 PM, Saturday April 13 from 10 AM to 5 PM, and Sunday April 14 from 10 AM to 5 PM. HSS members are invited to bring models for static display, bring indoor models to fly, and to help man the various club activities. - 9. Joni also commented that the Orange County Model Engineers who were applying for an renewal of their Use Permit received an extension of 30 years.
- 10. Emerald Harrington participated in Show-and Tell with his "White Wings" paper gliders. He said that they used to be available as a book of 15 glider designs for \$15. He flies free flight models in the grassy part of the park on Sundays from 7 to 10 AM.

 - No. 19. The activity schedule will be delayed, partly due to the unsure plans by Southern California Soaring Clubs (SC-2), Item No 38.
 - No. 20. Fred H. to plan a get together with John R and Henry to clean out and inventory the contents of the storage container. This is tentatively planned for a Friday in March.
 - No. 21. Fred H. volunteered to complete the club property inventory, but completion date is undefined.
 - No. 23. Jim Hanson has paid for our Internet Service Provider (Wix.com), and our Network Solutions redirect for 1hss.org service. Action item is now considered closed. See notes (above) on meeting with David Lapin concerning Social Media Manager.
 - No 24. Jim Hanson has paid for our Domain Name annual registration. Action item is now considered closed.
 - No. 27. Travis Black is no longer a member, and is not involved with acquiring HSS T-shirts. This
 action item will be on hold until someone wishes to take responsibility for procuring T-shirts and/or
 coffee mugs.
 - No. 29. Position of Alternate Safety Coordinator has been deleted. Not required by AMA. This action item is now considered closed.
 - No.32. The placard for the charge station will be made and installed by Jim Hanson. This topic to be closed when Jim completes the placard installation.
 - No.36. The \$100 donation went to Fairview Park Steering Committee. The conclusion to this item will be revised from \$20 to \$300, and this action item is considered closed.
- 3. A discussion was held concerning whether the city will allow us to conduct SC-2 events where participants do not have city flying permits. The city will be questioned as to whether their sanction relieves pilots from the need for a permit. An alternative suggestion is to purchase AMA insurance for each one day event.



When FAA registration was first required in December 2015, many of our members fulfilled the obligation and obtained their FAA registration, which is valid for three years. As the expiration date printed on the certificate approaches, these members have reached out to us to learn how to renew their FAA registration numbers. If you are a model aircraft owner who registered before December 12, 2017, and did not request to have your registration information deleted from the FAA's database, the FAA has extended the expiration date for you to December 12, 2020.

National Model Aviation Day registration is now open for 2019! It's hard to believe but this is the seventh year for this national celebration. The 2019 event will take place on August 17, 2019.



Three View Library



2019 City Flying Permits Available

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Renewal Packet must include ALL of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).

- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year), or home owner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.
