Executive Meeting Minutes for January 23,2015

- I. BUSINESS MEETING: Called to order at 2:30 P.M. by President Henry Smith III. Also in attendance were Jim Hanson, Treasurer; General Director John Anderson; Ted Broberg, Secretary; John Rittenhouose; Joni Whitsitt.
- A. Henry: We started mowing today, and will finish Saturday (1/24/'15). We'll schedule a further cleanup soon, depending on weather. Likely, Feb. 13-15; flying field first, then the rest of the park as needed. (See details on Page 10.) We need to cut back the tumbleweeds about 15 feet on the western edge of the field. To get rid of the leafy weeds, John R. suggests dragging it. Henry says sharp shovels do what we want. We were asked to REMOVE THE DEBRIS FROM THE SITE. Henry will provide the truck for hauling the trash-bags to the City yard. BRING FLAT SHOVELS TO SHEAR OFF THE LEAFY WEEDS.
 - JIM H.: Please post signs in advance of the cleanup.
- B. Henry: We have been invited to take art in "IMAGINOLOGY": he favors it, but feels that HSS should do either County Fair booth or IMAGINOLOGY, but not both. Joni: The other groups who have staffed the Or. County Fair don't wish to participate this year.
- It's at the County Fairgrounds, Friday, April 24 through Sunday, April 26, 2015. John A. submitted a proposal to the coordinator for this event. The booth would be free to non-profit groups.
- John A.: Application due by Feb. first; They will provide a table. WE provide insurance. He'll be judging a science and engineering show on the same dates, also at the Fairgrounds. IMAGINEERING in a non-competitive event. Orange County School Board hopes we will participate in this. Ideas: AEROSPACE ADVENTURE: We've been invited to have a booth. Suggested ideas:

 - 3. Rockets, paper gliders

Historical Society, Lyons Air Museum, Ralph Ranalli and his First Person View plane; Science Olympiad; UCI prize-winning Design/Build/Fly winning plane and team-member(s); make-and-take gliders;
 - 5. 3-D printer demonstration (Jim H.) and Air Wolf 3-D printers Co.
- Henry: If something flies indoors, we'd need a fence of some kind. That would be the size of an indoor basketball court. CHRISTINE: "No flying indoors."
- Planning issues: How much space is available? We've asked for 15'X 30' area, inside; outdoor flying area for quads, VAPORs, etc.; work tables;

Making the AMA's FPV Spotter Rule Work for Everyone

The most recent issue of Peak Charge, the newsletter of Silent Electric Flyers of San Diego (SEFSD), has this interesting solution to helping FPV pilots who do not have spotters. This seems like an easy solution to a problem that exists at our flying field.

Safe flying of FPVs at our field requires that pilots have a spotter. This is also an AMA rule. I understand it's not always convenient to ask someone to spot for you before you fly, so I'm asking everyone at the field work together to make FPV safe and practical. If you see someone flying without a spotter, kindly offer to spot for them. In fact, one can argue that anyone observing the FPV aircraft and within shouting distance of the pilot can be considered a spotter. This is a reasonable, practical interpretation of the AMA rule. The point is for someone to alert the pilot if they become out of bounds or are in danger of colliding with other aircraft, people, or the ground. If we look after each other, we can all safely enjoy our hobbies. Fairview Park Citizens Advisory Committee

January 7th 2015 was the next Fairview Park Citizens Advisory Committee (FPCAC) meeting. The following was taken from the Daily Pilot, which was commenting on the prior meeting. Their headline reads:

Meeting will focus on possibility of sports fields at Fairview Park

After being postponed for months, discussions about building sports fields in Costa Mesa's Fairview Park are coming back to the forefront.

The park's citizens advisory committee will meet Wednesday night to talk about adding baseball/softball facilities, basketball/handball courts, a roller hockey surface and multipurpose athletic fields to the park's southeast quadrant.

The <u>August meeting</u> of the committee generated a record turnout, with more than 125 people crowding the room. The committee also received more than 80 letters. But the committee decided to <u>hold off discussion</u> of the proposals, which have long generated heated debate in the community between those who want to keep the 208-acre park free of new development and those who contend the land would be a good spot for more athletic fields, particularly for youth sports.

The nine-member committee of City Council appointees has already rejected adding sports fields to the other three quadrants in Fairview Park, but hasn't decided about the roughly 45-acre southeast quadrant, the site of the tracks for the Orange County Model Engineers.

The rideable train setup uses about 40 acres of the quadrant. The Model Engineers, a volunteer-led nonprofit, has called Fairview Park home since 1988. In those years, the group has constructed about five miles of track, a station and a repair yard.

Some members of the Fairview Park Citizens Advisory Committee have said they believe sports fields would be suitable alongside the model train setup, using spaces not taken up by tracks.

Should a majority of the committee agree to the sport field idea, city staff would conduct a preliminary analysis for the committee to examine at another meeting. If a majority gives a second approval, the idea would go to the Parks and Recreation Commission for further review.

Wednesday's meeting begins at 6 p.m. in the Costa Mesa Neighborhood Community Center.

The Wednesday January 7 2015 meeting was attended by HSS President Henry Smith III, Secretary Ted Broberg, and John Rittenhouse who has provided the following comments.

Regarding last night's meeting, I've enclosed the following link: http://abubblingcauldron.blogspot.com/

From my observation, I submit the following comment/rant. The meeting was very contentious. Two years of meetings has resulted in absolutely nothing of substance being decided. <u>Despite</u> an endless parade of Academic's, Native American representatives, Civil Engineers/land use experts of all types, and most importantly the overwhelming majority of Costa Mesa citizens, the pro sports majority, successfully ramrodded their pro-baseball field agenda. Let me be clear, this not to say that baseball fields will be built, however unwarranted further studies, time, and money will be spent. And our secure expectation of continued usage of the park remains in question.

Committee members Frank Davern, Lee Ramos, and Dennis Popp were exceptionally deserving of condemnation. Their pre vote proclamations of un-bias and careful consideration of the "facts" flies in the face of two years of testimony, and betrays the public trust bestrode upon them. Unfortunately, the press accounts do not capture the true degree of their collective skullduggery.

While I hope and expect our club's operations will not be affected...the consequences of last night's vote, will delay any final determinations into the unforeseeable future.




HSS Membership



2014 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

WALK-IN Costa Mesa City Hall (77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa 92626), 3rd Floor Recreation Counter Tuesday through Thursday from 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM (excluding City-observed holidays),

MAIL-IN Mail your renewal packet (see list below), to include full payment, to:

Recreation Division – Fly Permit City of Costa Mesa, P. O. Box 1200, Costa Mesa, CA 92628

Renewal Packet must include ALL of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- Copy of your drivers license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet information via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.
