Urgent Request

HSS will be participating in the Orange County Imaginology event being held Friday thru Sunday April 15-17. See page 13 for further details. As part of our activities we will be offering computerized model flight simulation using the very popular RealFlight program. Previously, we have run this program on a laptop computer, which provides a 15 to 17 inch screen. This is not an effective way to reach larger groups of guests. You all have seen the large screen demonstrations at the AMA Convention, which attracts many enthusiasts at any given time. The club does not have a large screen TV, so, this is an appeal to anyone that has at least a 45" flat screen TV with at least one HDMI input, that would be willing to loan or donate the TV for this event. Parks and Recreation Commission

The Costa Mesa City Parks and Recreation Commission have monthly meetings that are open to the public. It is beneficial for HSS to be aware of the various activities so as to assure that model aircraft flying does not become limited or outlawed by over zealous city commissioners. Fortunately, Dick Odle who is one of our most talented watchdogs, monitored the most recent meeting, and prepared the following report.

The HSS was not mentioned, zip. The presentation of the Staff Report was given by Bart Mejia. A study of the fairy shrimp breeding habits within the Vernal Pools, as required by the USF&WS (US Fish & Wildlife Service), has not been possible due to a lack of rain. There is no time frame available for response from USF&WS on the city's proposal to them. The New Fairview Park Master Plan, when reviewed over the next year, will incorporate any USF&WS recommendations. Flo Martin, as a citizen, wants to see the USF&WS report soon so fencing can be in place soon (Speaking to the area by the High School). Fencing proposed by city is cable & post, as existent now, not chain-link. Location of fencing was not divulged by Bart.

I'm still curious, as we all should be, about the proposed location of the fencing. I suspect, having talked with the consulting biologist, the location may be just fine but I would love to approach Bart on this, given permission to do so from the HSS leadership... with great diplomacy of course.

Airline Facts

- Flights longer than 8 hours require 3 pilots (1 captain and 2 first officers) to rotate flying duties. Flights longer than 12 hours require 4 pilots (1 captain and 3 first officers). They usually fly 3-4 hour shifts.
- Each airline pilot flying the aircraft, eats a different meal to minimize the risk of all pilots on board being ill
- The first female flight attendants in 1930 were required to weigh less than 115 pounds. In addition, they had to be nurses and unmarried.

RC Model Aircraft Owner Registration with the FAA

AMA members are now required by regulation to register their aircraft with the FAA to avoid federal enforcement and potential penalties. All Radio Control modelers must register aircraft weighing greater than 0.55 pounds online no later than February 19, 2016. The registration fee is \$5. However, FAA is offering free registration when registering on or before midnight EST on January 21. Online registration can be accomplished on the FAA webpage at, RegisterMyUAS.faa.gov. Several AMA staff members and AMA leaders have been working with legal counsel and the FAA to find a solution for our members on the registration rule. To date, FAA has agreed in principle to several proposed initiatives that will help ease this process for our members in the future.

FAA Registration Results

The other night, the evening news reported that "Drone" registration with the FAA is over 175,000 pilots, exceeding the total number of general aviation pilots by at least 10,000. They mistakenly assumed these were all Drone operators. Interestingly, the total of AMA members is about 175,000 modelers.

Steering Committee Meeting Minutes for February 12

David Miller, our recently elected President, has stepped down from that position due to excess business activities. The following minutes describes the actions taken to establish Wade Rathbun as our new President, and the items of club business addressed at the meeting.

HSS Steering Committee Meeting

Held Friday 12 February 2016 at Nick's Pizza 2300 Harbor Blvd. Costa Mesa at 11:30 – 1:PM.

Attendance: Wade Rathbun, President; Henry Smith III, Vice President; Jim Hanson, Treasurer; Joni Whitsitt, General Director; Ted Broberg, Senior Flight Instructor; John Anderson, past General Director; Fred Hesse, Editor and acting secretary for this meeting.

Wade called the meeting to order at 11:50 AM. He gave some opening remarks concerning his meeting management style. Comments such as sticking to the agenda, strict scheduling of topics, assigning action items, and no interruptions were very well received. Wade stated that he wishes to bring John Hanson to speak at one of our meetings. John is ex-mayor of Duarte and a retired jet fighter pilot. Everyone agreed.

Next, Wade was unanimously voted in as the new HSS President. Note that this was required, as David Miller who was elected President in December had become overwhelmed with business activities, and had stepped down.

- Wade then proceeded with the first order of business, the HSS charter application to the AMA. A full board of officers is required but we were lacking a Secretary and Safety Officer. The committee determined that Wade would continue as interim Secretary, while both Wade and Jim H. continue their contacts with several potential applicants. Jim Hanson will continue as Treasurer, and assistant Safety Officer. It was announced that Vincent San Filippo Jr. has volunteered as Safety Officer. With these positions approved by the Executive Committee, Jim Hanson can now complete our charter application.
- Henry Smith III will complete our Gold Leader Club application after the club charter is submitted.
- Bylaws are in need of review and updating. This will be done at the next Steering Committee Meeting
 to be held on 1 March from 6 to 7PM, just prior to the next General Meeting. Jim H. will distribute MSWord copies of the bylaws by 16 February to each Steering Committee member. These are to be
 updated with suggestions in red and strikeout text and brought to the next Exec Meeting.
- In a similar manner, the club Membership Application will be distributed by Jim H. for Steering Committee members to red mark and bring for review at the next Steering Committee Meeting to be held on 1 March. The Application presently on our website will also be reviewed then.
- Other club documents needing review and updating will be processed in the near future.
- Next topic was the Orange County Imaginology event. This event is held at the Orange County Fairgrounds, and will occur Friday through Sunday April 15-17. Joni Whitsitt who is managing HSS participation has already arranged for HSS to join in this activity, and is meeting with Christine Dunst, OC Fair Management, during week of Feb 15-20 for planning. In addition to the indoor demonstrations as performed by HSS last year, Joni will attempt to arrange for an outdoor drone demonstration. Jim H. was requested to obtain AMA insurance for the indoor and outdoor activities of this event. John Anderson will provide the paper glider build and fly activity. The next HSS planning meeting for Imaginology will be at the March 1 Exec Meeting.
- The demonstration and air show planned for the Cub Scouts is tentatively on hold. David Miller will continue to be the primary contact. Joni Whitsitt will monitor planning and progress.
- Field maintenance in the form of mowing will be delayed until 20-21 February assuming there is no further rain. This will be the responsibility of Henry Smith III. An impromptu group will meet Saturday 13 February to remove weeds and rocks.

Steering Committee Meeting Minutes for February 12 (Continued)


- March is AMA Flying Safety month. Jim Hanson has volunteered to give a safety lecture at our next General Meeting on 1 March at 7 PM.
- Joni reports that two SC-2 glider competitions have been approved by the city. On 20 March, the
 Downey Soar Heads club will use Fairview Park to host their glider competition, and on 19 June HSS
 will conduct our competition as part of the 2016 Soaring Clubs of Southern California (SC-2) series.
- A new club member, Jamie Laflamme has volunteered to assist Ted Broberg in flight training.

The following topics were not placed on the agenda, and will be deferred to the next Steering Committee Meeting.

- Because David Miller is very involved with his business, there is concern that the web site may not receive attention to keep it current.
- Consider establishing Steering Committee Meetings regularly from 6 to 7 PM on the first Tuesday of each month, immediately prior to the regular General Meeting.
- It was proposed that a Membership Chairman be established to assist Jim Hanson.
- Does the club wish to return to the past activities of one or more in-club glider competitions, and an electric fun-fly per year?
- Provide Dick Odle permission to speak with Bart Mejia concerning proposed fencing at Fairview Park.

Balsa Density, Grain, and Grade

When you are tackling your next balsa project, spend a few moments to learn about the different densities, grades, and grains of balsa. Not all balsa is created equal and its application depends on the characteristics.


Balsa Grades

So how do you determine the density and grade of balsa? It is a two step process to determine the various density ranges shown above. First, weigh the sheet of balsa. While there are very accurate electronic scales, I'd suggest you use a small postage scale (the kind with a weight and clip). Once you know the weight of the balsa refer to the nomograph below to determine the density.

Balsa Density

After you weight a sheet of balsa the following nomograph is used to identify the balsa density and grade.



Balsa Density, Grain, and Grade (Continued)

Balsa Grains



Builders should take note of the different balsa grains. Each grain type has different characteristics and should be used in different applications.

Notice that the C-grain balsa sheet has a mottled appearance and distinct checkerboard pattern. It is very stiff across the sheet and splits easily. It will not easily wrap around curved surfaces without cracking. C-grain is used for sheet balsa wings and tails, flat fuselage sides, wing ribs, formers, and trailing edges. C-grain is usually hard to find in local hobby shops. I mainly use it for sheet tail surfaces.

B-grain grain lines are shorter than A-grain and it is less stiff than C-grain. If you look at the narrow edge of the balsa sheet, B-grain will look the same as it does on the wide, flat side. B-grain can go around soft curves without cracking. This grain is used for flat fuselage sides, wing ribs, formers, planking gradual curves, and wing leading edge sheeting.

A-grain has long fibers that show up as long grain lines. If you look at the narrow edge of the balsa sheet, A-grain will have a checkerboard appearance. This is the most flexible of all grains, and it is quite easy to wrap around curved surfaces. A-grain is typically used for sheet covering rounded fuselages and wing leading edges, planking fuselages, forming tubes, strong flexible spars, and hand launch glider fuselages.

2016 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

Renewal Packet must include **ALL** of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- Copy of your drivers license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet via email. If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300. Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to fall the City of Coate Many Ordinance No. 27 01. City Bernsleting for leaves and Developing

to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.


Photos of Your Planes
