- Wade showed a very exciting 4 minute video about F-16 jets.
- This was followed by a motivational video, featuring "Waldo", a jet pilot that gives motivational speeches to various organizations. Wade will attempt to get this pilot (who is a friend and/or business associate) to give a speech to HSS.
- Wade spoke of his vision and goals for the club. He is looking for club growth, collaboration among members, and wants to encourage the "Wing Man" spirit within the club. This concept embodies the idea that we all look out for each other. He wishes to get greater participation from members.
- Discussion was held concerning the search for a new secretary. Jim Hanson is looking, and Wade may have someone that he has contacted.
- Joni Whitsitt discussed her plans for the upcoming OC Fair Imaginology event to be held Friday Sunday April 15th through 17. Setup is Thursday. Steering Committee Meeting Minutes for Tuesday March 1, 2016

Meeting opened at 6:00 PM by Wade Rathbun.

- In attendance were the following: Wade Rathbun (President), Joni Whitsitt (General Director), John Anderson (Past General Director), Henry Smith III (Vice President), Jim Hanson (Treasurer), Jamie LaFlamme (Field Marshall), Fred Hesse (Editor and Acting Secretary).
- Wade and Jim Hanson discussed the status of obtaining a club secretary. Wade is working on that. He has a potential person, and will notify the committee as progress is made.
- David Miller our Social Media Manager, was not in attendance. Henry Smith had spoken to him and led the Committee to believe that David will continue as Social Media Manager.
- Henry Smith III deferred discussion of the 2016 AMA Gold Leader Club application he is processing for HSS.

Steering Committee Meeting Minutes for Tuesday March 1, 2016 (Continued)

- The club Bylaws are under revision. A discussion was held as to what revisions should be incorporated. Dick Odle who had proposed a very excellent set of revisions will assemble the various Committee inputs, and will distribute the final Bylaws to Steering Committee members for review.
- The club Membership Application is also under review. Joni says we have to have a nondiscrimination clause on both Bylaws and Membership Application.
- Plans were made to review all HSS documents. This is to be deferred to the next Steering Committee meeting.
- The HSS air show planned for the Cub Scouts is still on hold, pending response by the Cub Scouts with a convenient date. Joni Whitsitt will fill in for David Miller who made the initial contacts, but presently is not available.
- Joni Whitsitt discussed her plans for HSS support of the OC Fair Imaginology event to be held Friday April 15 through Sunday April 17. Joni had her meeting with Christine Dunst, and reports that our indoor flying space has been expanded to 50 by 100 feet. She is doing the planning, and will make a request for members staffing the various demonstrations at the next General Meeting. Randy will check on availability of a large screen TV. Jim Hanson has applied for AMA insurance for the Imaginology event. Joni is trying to arrange space for outdoor flying of 3-D stunt aircraft and helicopters. This may require additional insurance.
- The Downey SoarHeads will be using our field to host the SC-2 soaring competition on Sunday March 20. No additional assistance by HSS is required. Jim Hanson has confirmed that no additional AMA insurance is required for this event so long as it is sanctioned by the AMA. Editor's note: See latest details of this event elsewhere in this newsletter.
- HSS will host the SC-2 glider competition on Sunday June 19, at Fairview Park. Member assistance, trophy costs, miscellaneous costs, contest director, who to contact to help, to be determined. Bruce Schaefer is doing the planning, and will ask for assistance at the June 7th General meeting Joni reports that AMA requires additional insurance for events, and Greg Stone (AMA Area X Assistant Vice President) confirmed that it is good practice. Jim Hanson has subsequently acquired the added insurance.
- A discussion was held as to whether to establish the position of Membership Chairman, a person to assist Jim Hanson. Wade Rathbun is looking for someone who would help to increased membership. Jim Hanson suggests this title be Public Relations Chairman. Tabled for next meeting.
- Is the club interested in having in-club glider competitions and electric fun fly events like used to be held years ago. Dick Odle says we should pole the glider guys. Both John Anderson and Jamie LaFlamme suggested having glider guys train power guys.
- City of Costa Mesa commission meetings need attending. Dick Odle volunteered to monitor the City Council meetings and the Parks Commission meetings. It is not clear who will be attending the quarterly Orange County Parks Department meetings.
- Club runway and equipment maintenance: Jamie LaFlamme was appointed grounds keeper in charge of mower maintenance. This position, which has previously been called Field Marshal, should also include compiling the club inventory.
- Jamie wants to chalk the runway. Henry Smith III says that is not likely to be approved. Jamie wants to know what the rules are for areas that can be scraped or mowed. Henry Smith will provide the written rules.
- Joni Whitsitt obtained city permission to put up two new field signs. These signs list the flying rules and flying areas for the various types of planes.

Item 5. Establish formally scheduled Steering Committee meetings.

- The next Steering Committee meeting will be Saturday April 16 at 12:30 PM, held at Woody's Diner at Brookhurst and Adams.
- Subsequent Steering Committee meetings will be held from 6-7 PM just prior to the General Meetings at Round Table Pizza. Special meetings will be called as needed.

New Business - Joni is proposing a series of activities intended to bring attention to HSS, promote community service, and encourage fun activities within the club.

Item 6. Flight Safety Seminar at Fairview Park. The intent is to welcome all fliers (including non-members) and establish a safety oriented image for the club.

- A suggestion was made that the Parks Commission might send out a notice to all flyers with city permits. Also discussed, that the city Permit Process require attendance to a Flight Safety Seminar. Joni will talk to Robert Staples about this.
- The Safety Seminar is planned for Saturday May 21.
- Who conducts the Seminar was not determined.
- A big discussion was held concerning the map of our flying area and rules. The map needs to show slope soaring area.

Item 7. Hot Dog Day at Fairview Park. This is intended as a treat for HSS members.

- This is planned for Saturday July 23, and promotes general fun flying.
- Joni will provide hot dogs and buns. The club will purchase condiments and drinks.
- We will use the adjacent covered area which rents for \$30 for a Costa Mesa resident.

Item 8. Community Open House at the HSS flying field. The intent is to invite schools, city leadership, and environmental groups.

- This event is planned for Saturday August 16.
- Activities would include flying lessons, discussions of safety rules, and HSS concern for the environment. It would also be a regular flying day, demonstrating the types of planes we fly.

Item 9. SC,2 contest at OCMA. This was tabled for later discussion.

Item 10. Scarecrow event hosted by the City of Costa Mesa.

- This is presently unscheduled by the City, but is anticipated to be in October.
- HSS will participate.

Item 11. Concern about David Miller's availability.

- Joni had a meeting with David Miller. He will be dealing only with Joni. He is still planning to support the club.
- Item 12. Inventory will be updated. Jamie will take care of this by next steering committee meeting.

RC Model Aircraft Owner Registration with the FAA

AMA members are now required by regulation to register their aircraft with the FAA to avoid federal enforcement and potential penalties. All Radio Control modelers must register aircraft weighing greater than 0.55 pounds online no later than February 19, 2016. The registration fee is \$5. However, FAA is offering free registration when registering on or before midnight EST on January 21. Online registration can be accomplished on the FAA webpage at, RegisterMyUAS.faa.gov. Several AMA staff members and AMA leaders have been working with legal counsel and the FAA to find a solution for our members on the registration rule. To date, FAA has agreed in principle to several proposed initiatives that will help ease this process for our members in the future.

FAA Registration Results

The other night, the evening news reported that "Drone" registration with the FAA is over 175,000 pilots, exceeding the total number of general aviation pilots by at least 10,000. They mistakenly assumed these were all Drone operators. Interestingly, the total of AMA members is about 175,000 modelers.

AMA Progress With Government Relations

AIRR Act passes Transportation and Infrastructure Committee

We have good news to share. Thursday, February 11, 2016 the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee in the House of Representatives passed the Aviation Innovation, Reform, and Reauthorization (AIRR) Act, which preserves and strengthens the Special Rule for Model Aircraft.

We would like to thank Rep. Bill Shuster of Pennsylvania, Chairman of the Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, and Rep. Mark Sanford of South Carolina for their efforts to ensure that this important legislation protects the hobby of flying model aircraft.

The AIRR Act is critical to preserving our voluntary, community-based approach to managing the model aviation community. By strengthening the Special Rule for Model Aircraft, this bill will enhance safety across the recreational community and allow our members, who for decades have flown safely and responsibly within AMA's community-based safety program, to continue enjoying our hobby without new burdensome regulations. Among the bill's provisions, it provides a clear definition of a community-based organization (CBO) and tasks the FAA with developing a process for recognizing qualifying CBOs, both long-overdue tasks for the agency. In addition, the bill makes clear that model aircraft can be used as a teaching tool for science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), as well as aeronautics.

The AIRR act is a strong bill that we are proud to support, but Congress isn't done with it yet. The full House of Representatives still needs to vote on the AIRR Act and the Senate still needs to work on its own version of the bill. AMA has been actively advocating for our members' interests on Capitol Hill, and we will continue working with Congress on additional changes that could further protect our hobby.

We may need your help in reaching out to members of Congress to urge them to support the Special Rules for Model Aircraft, which provides critical protections for the model aviation community. Remain vigilant and continue to monitor emails, social media, and www.modelaircraft.org/gov for more information and updates.






Local Air Shows

2016 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet via email. If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300. Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need

to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.


