#### **General Meeting Minutes for May 6, 2014**

Meeting was held at Round Table Pizza, Fountain Valley, CA.

In attendance were President Jesse Calleros, Vice President and General Director Henry Smith III, Treasurer Jim Hanson, Photographer Rob Askegaard, and Secretary Ted Broberg. Also attending: Ross Thomas, Bob Voss, Sid Hood, Henry Smith 4, Mike Fox, Bill Sharkey, Roger Nahas, Dave Whittington, Gary Baldwin, Randy Wilbur, Joni Whitsitt, John Anderson, John Rittenhouse, and visitor Mitch Dreyer.

- **I. General Session:** Called to order at 7:20 by Jesse C.
- A. Introductions: Visitor Mitch Dreyer. Mitch used to fly slope planes on the bluff.
- B. RCX show: Henry 4: He'll try to get more admission tickets than the two per day he was offered. Joni has a contact who may arrange for more. There will be no free parking. Henry 4 has two people per shift, for the two days. Joni's P-51 will be there. Randy suggests having a video of our field running. Henry 3 will have a large photo poster showing the field set up. Joni: Your key issues are who to contact, promoting club, the field, your training program, where to find us. John A.: Mention our meetings, and free raffle prizes.
- C. Flight instructors: we need more regulars. Contact Jesse.
- D. Field cleanup: this Saturday, May 10.
- E. Pam McFadden has some more things left, after her parking lot sale of her late husband's stuff. Jesse has the contact information.
- F. Dave W. has some concerns about non-members using power stations. Some key-holder has been leaving the box open. Apparently it was opened to reach the A/C sockets, and then not locked.
- G. Member of the month nominations: Ross Thomas and Jim Hanson. Ross was selected. Maybe Jim Hanson will be next month.
- H. Name labels for planes: AMA requires owner's name, address, or AMA number on them. Jim Hanson will print your info, with your choice of graphic or HSS logo, on Avery self-adhesive labels: sheet of 30 for \$3.00. Henry commented that Jim makes graphics, vinyl letters, laser printing on vinyl. Contact Jim.
- I. Ted showed a photo of John A. with his class at Teen Center, Downtown Recreation Center, and our new Flight Simulator computer.

#### II. Program: Show and Tell.

- A. John Anderson brought two planes.
- 1. CENTURY: pod-and-boom, with folding prop.
- 2. ROTOR CONCEPTS RS 1, Foamie Pusher, with video camera. It sends monochrome video to the transmitter; and has auto-pilot, with auto return. He bought it at the AMA show for \$162. He added a single wheel under the nose. Beautiful flier. Uses a 450 mAh on-board battery to run flight controls as well as the camera gear.
- B. Randy Wilbur brought his Hobby People B & H Black Horse F-4 U CORSAIR. It's a plastic skinned model that he wanted to look scale. He applied Scotch Guard to de-glaze the plastic skin, then sprayed it with Testors Marine Blue paint. For the checkerboard pattern on the cowl, he did a lot of masking with auto trim tape, and lots of cutting. Jim Hanson offered to make vinyl checkerboard designs for those who want them. Randy modified the control horns to hide them, so he used several tricks to clean it up. For internal. panel lines, he used a flexible straightedge from an art supply store. For rivets, he has a stencil from TOP FLITE to add detail to panels. The stencil also has features like fuel hatches, etc. He used a lot of books to find the full-size plane he's replicating. He has a friend in the Scale Squadron who cut the lettering for him. He wanted a plane that stood out from all the other plastic planes that people throw together. Randy used a Zenoa G-62 engine, with ignition, Airtronics radio; full retracts on mains. He flies it with a two-bladed prop. Wings do not fold, but remove for transporting. Wing span: 91". Pneumatic retracts. To detail the rivets, plot your panel lines first. Then spot the corner rivets next, then place the ones in between. Your eyes won't notice uneven spacing, but if the corners aren't right, it's very noticeable.

#### **General Meeting Minutes for May 6, 2014 (Continued)**

C. Henry Smith 4 brought a 26 gram PEANUT SCALE (13") rendition of the MAMBO. It is a Bob Selman Models design with laser-cut parts, a geared motor, and a Brick receiver. It has Sol-Lite covering, SHARPIE windows, (stenciled), 2.75" prop. (BSD MICRO) and it flies well. His rule: "One gram per square inch of wing loading."

Henry 4 also brought an ACE R/C "LITTLEST STICK" model, built from a kit he got from the estate of Dwight Currithers. Hobby People ESC 6 amp, 2 small servos (brand X), BL1504 outrunner motor. "A truly vintage

#### **Executive Meeting Minutes for May 2, 2014**

Your editor would like to complement our President, Jesse Calleros, for the organization of this meeting. Several days prior, Jesse sent out a 12 point Action Item agenda, which was followed to a reasonable degree as shown in the notes below. This is the first time in years that such order has been held in an HSS meeting. The final touch of class hopefully will be follow up and conclusion to each topic. Great job Jesse!!

The meeting was called to order at 1:55 p.m. at CSS. In attendance were President Jesse Calleros, Vice President/General Director Henry Smith III, Treasurer Jim Hanson, John Anderson, Joni Whitsitt, and Secretary Ted Broberg.

To begin with, Jesse said that it's possible for us to have Gary Fogel to speak at another general club meeting. The following is Jesse's agenda.

- Club Rules: We have several versions printed and posted, and these should be simplified.
- A. John R. suggested the formation of an executive committee to review the rules. Henry volunteered to work on this with John Rittenhouse, Bart Mejia, and Robert Staples. Henry would like to have this include safety qualifications to get a City permit.
- B. Henry pointed out that very few planes show the AMA number, name, and contact information, as required by AMA.
- 2- Heli/quad flyers: There is no room for them right now. Fish and Wildlife Department may let us know if/when the Keep-Out regions are more clearly defined. For now, Helis must share the field under the same rules as fixed-wing craft.

#### **Executive Meeting Minutes for May 2, 2014 (Continued)**

- 3- HSS website: John R. and Fred are working on revising it. Henry suggests that we make specific suggestions regarding particular pages and listings. Jesse would like more current photos.
- 4- RCX Show: **Henry IV** has things on the way. Joni has information and some equipment to lend us, which she'll bring to our May 6 meeting. She suggests using the frame of an Easy-Up for a device to hang planes, banners, etc. Further, she says **FREE PASSES will be handed out FRIDAY**, **but must be ordered ahead of time**.
- 5- Webcam/weather station: (Ted suggested getting weather information from John Wayne Airport via internet.) Jim H. says we should check with Weather Underground. (Good one Jim. These meetings are loaded with humor. Ed) Jesse has looked into it with his IT guys.

In a separate E-mail, John Rittenhouse had the following comments:

For years there has been talk of installing a weather station/web cam at our flying site. NOW is the time to act on this! This is the perfect time to show the City an example of the benefits of the club having the security of a five year renewal... and how we can now "give back" to the City by installing a web cam to survey (and thus provide additional security) to the relatively un-patrolled Fairview Park! I understand other clubs have successfully done similar projects. Perhaps we can tap them for assistance. In the mean time we should form a SIG to study the idea, and ACT on it! - 7- Aerial Photography for city: The City would like us to provide this service this summer. John A. suggests there might be emergency/safety issues that we could help with.
- 8- Free Flight flyers: John A. would like us to do some joint activities with them.
- 9- Field Clean up Day \*
- 10- City Council Meeting \*
- 11- The club's REAL FLIGHT Simulator is up and running. Demo today at Teen Center.
- 12- John A. would like to start an R/C build contest with the Teen Center and Girls Inc. He spoke with the principal at Rea School. She's very enthused about our efforts with Mr. Harmon's class, and is considering a model airplane club.
- \* John and Ted had to leave to teach at Costa Mesa's Downtown Recreation Center at 2:50 p.m., and missed these topics. Fortunately, Joni Whitsitt filled in for Ted with the following.
- 9- Field Cleanup: Jesse proposed field cleanup day be Saturday, May 10th starting at 9:00 am. Jesse suggested the cleanup volunteers work in 1/2 hours shifts so the volunteers could still have time to fly their planes. Jesse will bring water and donuts for volunteers. Jesse will have Hank announce at the general meeting.
- 10- City Council Meeting: Jesse and Henry talked about their preparations for the upcoming meeting Tuesday, May 6th with the City Council.

#### Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting for April 24, 2014

Ted Broberg provides the following comments concerning the City of Costa Mesa Parks and Recreation Commission meeting held April 24, 2014.

It looks like "There's good news tonight." At the session of the Parks and Recreation Commission this evening, several of our members spoke in favor of recommending a five-year renewal of the use permit, and asked if some of the wording of the proposed changes to the document be reconsidered.

Henry Smith III noted that these proposed changes were unworkable, as HSS has no authority to enforce the rules. We can remind fliers of the regulations, and request their compliance, and remind them that our duty is to refer continued violation to the Park Ranger. John Rittenhouse agreed, and stated that we are governed by the AMA, and their insurance covers us. He said he had heard that a rewrite was being considered. John Anderson stated that our community education at schools, Girls Inc, and Teen Center is well under way. Jesse Calleros echoed these ideas.

Commissioner Harper said it would be inconsistent that HSS be made responsible, as not all fliers are HSS members.

Commissioner Graham: "It seems to be overstepping to ask them to bear the responsibility to enforce."

Chairman De Arakal moved to recommend the renewal for five years, with certain changes to the proposed revisions, deleting many of the phrases in red type, especially in paragraphs 2, 4, 5 and 12.

Motion passed 5 to 0.

#### **Sven Backlund - Memorial**

We are very sorry to report that HSS member Sven Backlund died of a stroke about April 24, 2014. Ted Broberg reports that services were held at Hope Chapel, Indianapolis and Lake, Huntington Beach, on April 26, at 3:00 p.m. Sven has been an enthusiastic member since 2013, and everyone will miss him at the flying field.



#### From Inland Soaring Society

Your editor shares newsletters with a number of local clubs. Inland Soaring Society's (ISS) president Mike Lee just sent this safety warning, well written in a humorous style, which unfortunately happened to him.

I was crouched down shooting photos of an aero bowling event. A pilot was coming from left to right with a Slo-Stik at low altitude and medium power. As his plane went over the pins, I shot a photo or two. When I looked through the viewfinder again, the plane was coming towards me, but I couldn't quite tell from how far. So, I peeked up above the camera only to find... "HOLY CRAPS, THERE IS A PLANE RIGHT HERE RIGHT NOW!!!!" I'm not kidding, I had flashbacks of this very moment all day long. The last thing I saw before impact was the prop nut screw of the propeller coming right at my head in stark, living color!!

Now, trying to explain this whole episode to the Urgent Care physician was a little perturbing.

Doc: "What did you say happened?"

Me: "I was hit by a model plane."

Doc: "No, I mean what cut you up? A knife, a saw or razor?"

Me: "I said a model plane hit me. It was powered by a motor with a propeller on it."

Doc: "You were flying a model plane and you hit yourself?"

Me: "No, I was taking photos of the plane when it hit me."

Doc: "what, were you standing on the runway or something?"

Me: I only wish I was...at least I would have expected to get hit. "No, Doc, I was on the side shooting photos and one got away from the pilot and I found it face-to-face."

Doc: "Maybe you should use a longer lens."

Me: "That was the longer lens!"

Doc: "oh. Next time, duck!"

So, with that, I walked out with a few stitches in my hand and not much smarter after the conversation with the physician. But, I did survive which also means that the assassination attempt failed,

This drove Mike to compose the following safety suggestions:

- ? When dropping eggs, fake bombs, drop tanks and canopy covers, do not watch the object that dropped...watch your plane!!!
- ? When bowling with a plane, don't watch the bowling ball. Watch the plane!
- ? When flying combat, watch your own plane!
- ? When doing the Balloon Bust, just go after the balloon!
- ? When flying around the field, if you happen to see a tree coming between you and your plane, you're going to hit a tree...do something about it!
- ? The sequence is, transmitter ON first, airplane second, airplane turned OFF first, transmitter last.
- ? Fly with a spotter, and don't use the guy who is shooting photos. You might hit him!
- ? If you are shooting photos of the planes, WATCH THE PLANE!(Run if necessary!).

This month we are presenting a Gee Bee Senior "E" Sportster by Gary Gullickson. Gary says it really should be a "Y" and have two cockpits. The motor is a Cobra 3525/12 with a Cobra 60 amp ESC, 4s 4500 lipo pack and 15-8 prop. It's a Maxford ARF and has a 58" span.



#### **UCI Aircraft Design Team**

We are always pleased to have the various aerodynamics classes from University of California/Irvine use our Fairview Park runway in their research. In this case, the project is called Variable Flex Active Wing Gust Control. Rob Askegaard has provided the following photos of their model aircraft flown by Colin Sledge.

Based upon the project name, we did a little research, and came up with what may describe the UCI project.

Active Aeroelastic Wing (AAW)
Technology is multidisciplinary in that it integrates air vehicle aerodynamics, active controls, and structural aeroelastic behavior to maximize air vehicle performance. The concept uses wing aeroelastic flexibility for a net benefit and enables the use of high aspect ratio, thin, swept wings that are aeroelastically deformed into shapes for optimum performance. This makes it possible to achieve the multipoint aerodynamic performance required of future fighter, bomber, and transport aircraft.

**PR:** How did you get started in the hobby?


**Ross:** I started flying control line and building in the mid 50's and in 1974 a buddy that learned to fly while in the service got me started in RC flying.





#### Be a Concerned Enthusiast - Support the AMA

As discussed in the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation (the AMA publication sent to all AMA members), the federal government has passed the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, which includes Sec. 336 Special Rule for Model Aircraft. This law prevents the FAA from passing any rule that controls model aircraft being flown under the AMA safety code. This Act resulted in part by the 90,000+ letters written by AMA members to their representatives.

The AMA will shortly be facing a new FAA regulation called the "small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (sUAS) rule. In the next several months the FAA will post the preliminary regulation for public review. At this time the AMA will initiate a concerned citizens organization made up of AMA members to express their opinions of the preliminary regulation. To do this rapidly, the AMA will again contact all members by E-mail with instructions on comments and congressional contacts, which means the AMA needs everyone's current E-mail address. If you are not presently receiving occasional E-mail from the AMA, please go to <a href="www.modelaircraft.org">www.modelaircraft.org</a> and update your personal information. It is important for all of us to support the AMA especially in this endeavor.

#### 2014 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to <a href="www.costmesaca.gov">www.costmesaca.gov</a> and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2013.pdf. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

**MAIL-IN** Mail your renewal packet (see list below), to include full payment, to:

Recreation Division – Fly Permit City of Costa Mesa, P. O. Box 1200, Costa Mesa, CA 92628

Renewal Packet must include **ALL** of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- Copy of your drivers license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet information via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.
