

Power Station Locking Procedure

There have been recent problems with use of our Power Station for battery chargers. It has been left unlocked and subject to vandalism. Ted Broberg has taken the following steps to correct the problem.

I bought a MASTER weather-resistant lock and had 10 keys made for it. I'll bring them to the December party/dinner, so we can inform the troops of the new system for controlled use of the power station and its contents (staple gun, fire extinguisher, first aid kit, key for the "butt-box"/ash tray). I suggest that we have a check-out card with a brief statement of the use policy and lock-up rules, whenever such can be formulated, for each key-holder to fill out and return to the keeper of the keys. I can do that (keep track of the key-holders), or maybe Todd MacAndrew will add that to his winch/container monitor duties.

Also, Henry 3 suggested last Saturday that it's likely time to pull a maintenance on the ride-on mower: oil change, filters, battery water, blade and belt service and tire pressures, at least. I have four jack-stands, if that's a way to steady the critter while we service the belts and blades and drain the oil. Karl did not fill me in on the parts it likes, but Hub Auto Parts should have what we want when we find out what that is.

and 20 LOOPS in a time of one minute, wheels up to wheels down.

- -- Henry Smith 4 took 3rd in LIMBO at 4', and 3rd in 20 LOOPS, with a time of 1:40.
- -- Henry Smith III flew the mighty WINGO to 2nd in LIMBO, clearing the tape at 3'. It bounced off the Surveyor's Tape on one attempt! (Crepe paper and adding machine tape were tried first, but neither of them stood up to the rain. John Bollinger came up with the tape. Thanks, John!


This was really different from the past two FUN FLY events, which were run in high winds, earlier in the season. There was a lot of laughing this year!

Latest Development with Fairview Park

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has directed the city of Costa Mesa to remove two man-made trails threatening a tiny endangered species that breeds in the seasonal ponds at Fairview Park.

Both trails, located along the 208-acre park's southeastern edge next to Parsons Field and Estancia High School, were topped in the summer with decomposed granite, which the federal agency fears will harm the San Diego fairy shrimp this winter.

The work was done without the city's permission, possibly by volunteers unaware of the area's biological significance. No one has taken responsibility for the work. From: 29 Dec 2013 Daily Pilot newspaper.

Seen Around the Lake at Huntington Beach Central Park

Bob Goff took his new de Havilland (of Canada)
Beaver to one of the lakes at Huntington Beach Central Park, and brought along our club photographer, Rob Askegaard. Rob got some great photos, and provided the following comments.

Bob Goff's de Havilland of Canada Beaver on floats might be a first for the HSS newsletter. A floatplane in action on the water and flying is truly unique. 2013 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

Renewal Packet must include ALL of the following:

- ? Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- ? Copy of your drivers license.
- ? Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- **?** Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet information via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying Field Rules which are all posted at Fairview Park and on our web site at www.1hss.org. You do not need to be a Harbor Soaring Society member (but it is good to have you join us).

FAA endorses AMA rules to govern personal use of sUAS for agriculture

The FAA has endorsed AMA's safety guidelines for the personal use of small unmanned aircraft systems (sUAS) for agricultural applications. Stated by the FAA in an online news story by Oklahoma City Channel 9 News, "Farmers may operate an unmanned aircraft over their own property for personal use ... Guidelines for the operation of model aircraft, such as those published by the Academy of Model Aeronautics, may be used by farmers as reference for safe model UAS operations." This is a great achievement for the Academy in its efforts to welcome the sUAS community.


