General Meeting Minutes, April 4 2017.

The General Meeting of HSS was held on Tuesday April 4, at Round Table Pizza, Fountain Valley, CA. The meeting convened at 7:07 P.M. Joni Whitsitt, President, officiating.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Imaginology

This event is scheduled for Friday, April 21, Saturday, April 22, and Sunday, April 23, 2017 at the OC Fair Grounds. Volunteer sheets were passed around, and members were asked to sign up for 2-3 hour shifts. Volunteers are needed for the flight simulator station and John Anderson's Build N' Fly activity. We will also have a static model display. Knights of the Round Circle will participate on Saturday and Sunday, and the Civil Air Patrol will have a full scale flight simulator, glider, and wind tunnel. Students will primarily be in attendance on Friday, and the event will be open to the public on Saturday and Sunday.

Guest Speaker:

Larry "The Colonel" Klingberg, Master Builder and recent inductee into the AMA Hall of Fame, presented his latest building project, a Mignet Pou-du-Ciel. The Flying Flea is essentially a highly staggered biplane. Larry currently has the plane in bones, and is building the "Flying Flea" for the static competition for AMA Expo 2018.

The odd name comes from the French nickname for the Ford Model T automobile, "Pou de la Route" or "Louise of the Road" because Henry Ford's economy car was so common and initially came only in black. Although Henri Mignet took flying lessons, he could not get the hang of flying, so he dreamed of creating a Model T of the air, an airplane for the common man hence "Pou-du-Ciel". The HM14 was first of Henri's plane that was a success. The thirteen planes prior to that were not very good! Henri published books on how to build his planes, which become sold out editions. When eleven people died flying Henr's planes. England and France put a damper on them until Henri added a fix using a conjugated wing that the authorities accepted.

Over time, the models evolved into sleek planes that could fly at 120 mph, and pilots began adding conventional aircraft motors. One could say that Henri was the father of ultra-light aviation.

Larry's model is 5/8 scale and the wingspan is 13'. He began it 6 months ago, and has built it mostly out of white pine. Incredibly, Larry only has about \$80 in materials in the plane so far! The cowl is 20 years old from a Balsa USA Sopwith Pup. The nose of the plane is a roll of aluminum material from Home Depot, and the remainder of the fuselage is covered in Solartex fabric. The model has Dubro wheels, Hitec servos, and Larry plans to make the pilot figure. The entire plane will weigh 60lbs complete.

Show 'n Tell

Chuck Harrington presented his EasyBuiltModel kit – completely old school with printed on balsa parts, no die or laser cut. The wing is held on with wires, not glue. Chuck demonstrated his method of determining the area of a wing that is curved in two directions. The kit came with a 6" propeller, but he needed an 8" one, so he carved it. Chuck likes to select his own balsa wood because you really don't know the quality of the wood that comes in the kit.



More Fairy Shrimp

On Thu, Mar 23, 2017 at 4:54 PM, Richard Odle reported: "At the City Council meeting Tuesday, at Public Comments 4, a video was shown regarding a newly discovered Vernal Pool at the park. The council showed interest in this regarding additional protection potentially being required. The so-called pool is just a VERY small "pool" of ponded water but clearly contains San Diego fairy shrimp. The link to the video is shown below. However, given the background seems to be looking over the cliff to the West-Southwest (notice power lines towers), the sign and the path, plus the presenter's mention of the 'road'. My guess is that the 'pool' is one of the three locations marked on the second image." Note: The second image could not be recovered from the E-mail, but the location is out near the bluff. - Ed.

2017 City Flying Permits Available

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. This permit can be obtained by going to www.costmesaca.gov and downloading the file Model Airplane Fly Permit 2014.pdf You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

Renewal Packet must include **ALL** of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).

- Copy of your drivers license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet via email. If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying rules posted at the flying site.


