Executive and General Meeting Minutes for April 1, 2014

Meeting was held at Round Table Pizza, Fountain Valley, CA.

In attendance were President Jesse Calleros, Vice President and General Director Henry Smith III, Photographer Rob Askegaard, and Secretary Ted Broberg. Also attending: Ross Thomas, Bob Voss, Sid Hood, Henry Smith 4, Mike Fox, Bill Sharkey, Wayne Spani, Ezekiel Seraphin, and Michael Prutz.

I. Executive Session: Called to order at 6:30 p.m.

- A. Henry 3: Regarding the Parks and Recreation Commission: Henry: John Anderson recommends that we appoint a liaison person to maintain a presence with them. John A. and Henry offered to serve.
 - B. Jesse: The key point with the Commission appears to be the treatment of the vernal ponds.
- C. Henry: We have aerial photos that show that our field does not encroach on the vernal pools. We'll want to look closely at the surveys that the Federal entities produce.
- D. John A.: He and Ted B. will be teaching planes and flying skills to young people, and would like to get a 17" laptop computer and flight simulator for use at the field and in classrooms. Henry will raise the matter at the general session. ANYONE WANT TO MAKE A CONTRIBUTION OF EQUIPMENT? Contact any officer of the club.
- E. Ted B. suggests that we write a letter requesting that we obtain permission from the Parks and Recreation Commission to renew the lines that delineate the field. Recent rains have washed them out. Ted will draft a letter and send it to Henry 3, to be forwarded through channels.

II. General Session: Called to order at 7:20 by Jesse C.

- A. Introductions:
 - 1. Wayne Spani, invited HSS to attend the Dawn Patrol October 18 -19 event. See item C. below.
 - 2. Bill Sharkev.
- B. Jesse: Report on the March 27th Parks and Recreation Commission.
 - 1. One citizen was upset by noisy planes and late flying. Remedy: Call the Ranger.
 - 2. Next P and R meeting: April 24. We should have several members attend.
- 3. Trifold brochures: They've been updated and printed. He also showed a sample of a single-page handbill to consider having produced.
 - 4. Jesse suggested that we consider getting some new tents.
- 5. RCX show on May 17-18: Henry 4 sent a sign-up sheet around. Sign up for "all day," and he'll work a schedule around it. Some help needed for set-up Friday, 5/16. Sid H. asked what a booth worker would do. Hank told some of the things we've done at the County Fair. Mostly, don't ignore a "customer," don't sit and talk with other workers when people approach. We want to "sell them" on our field, especially electric planes and gliders. We might have Joni's Flight Simulator, and Ted's "Flier on a Wire."
- -- Wayne: You need "eye candy," to attract people. For the AMA show, Scale Squadron made a huge HANGAR display.
- 6. ZEKE S.: Let's put together a Park Cleanup Day. He can put up posters, and arrange info for the NEWSLETTER.
- C. PROGRAM: Wayne Spani, Scale Squadron. This year is the beginning of the HUNDREDTH YEAR of military aircraft! This October, we'll be commemorating it in a two-day event portraying what it was really like in that day. The New HSS Laptop Computer

John Anderson and Ted Broberg felt that they needed a laptop computer with RealFlight simulator for use as a teaching aid in their Design/Build/Fly classes at some of the local schools, and at our field. After some research by our President Jesse Calleros, Ted has provided the following report.

Jesse and I just got back from his IT/computer guys with a nice DELL laptop that runs REAL FLIGHT simulator. It has a non-glare screen, and if we use it in a "shadow box" type sunlight shroud, it should serve us well at the field. I'll try it at the field this Friday, weather permitting.

We had a snag while installing Jim H's version 6.5 tonight, as it required contacting GREAT PLANES/REAL FLIGHT for a code number. Instead, the guy installed my version 3.0, and it runs just fine. Perhaps later we can change over to Jim's unit, but for the introductory flier, I think this will be adequate.

I plan to show John A. the setup tomorrow when we do an introductory presentation at Rea School. More on that in later days.

John and I visited GIRLS INC. yesterday, and put plans in motion for five coming Monday sessions.

Thanks, Ted for your inputs. When it is HSS's turn to conduct the SC-2 glider competitions, this computer might also be used to run the scoring program that is used for calculating results.

Student Training

John Anderson and Ted Broberg are finding increased opportunities to present their Design/Build/Fly program to local schools. In this case, they attended an awards ceremony at Rea School at the invitation of Mr. Harmon who conducts a five week series in aviation. Rea Elementary School is located in Costa Mesa, South of Victoria, and is in the Newport-Mesa Unified School District. John and Ted will assist in the five week aviation classes, using the new HSS laptop computer and RealFlight simulator, and other instructional material that John provides. Student Training (Continued)

Ted Broberg has provided the following description of his activities at Rea Grammar School.

Fifth Grade teacher Aaron Harmon invited John Anderson and Ted Broberg to take part in Rea School's regular awards ceremony and flag salute. John and Ted went there on On Wednesday, April 16th, and set up shop at a stage on the playground. After the awards were given for the winners in their keyboarding ("typing," for those of us who remember typewriters) competitions, John gave an introduction to his Design/Build/Fly program, and invited students from fourth through sixth grade to sign up for the 12 to 15 spots that will be open. Prior to the start of school, Ted was able to show his "Flier on a Wire" dynamic flight simulator, with several boys and girls operating the trainee's radio. We also debuted our new Great Planes FLIGHT SIMULATOR, hitched to the newly-acquired DELL laptop computer that our President Jesse Calleros purchased this past week. Jim Hanson offered the loan of his Simulator program for our use. It appears that it will be more useful inside a classroom or auditorium than outdoors. We fitted in a few demo flights of a QUAD-COPTER. There was a good deal of interest, and we are looking forward to the start of Mr. Harmon's program this week. More on this later. Ted Broberg

John Anderson then prepared the following third person description of his Design/Build/Fly program.

John Anderson and Ted Broberg are hard at work implementing and expanding the HSS education and recreation-based community outreach program.

John does mostly the introductory in-classroom "Design. Build and Fly" instruction - progressing from a variety of simple toss gliders, to-walk along gliders, and finally to capacitor-powered gliders, all of which help demonstrate aerodynamic principles, shapes and proportions, drawing and pattern-making, materials and methods, and flight adjustments and control. This is followed by student presentations and funfocused competitions such as design, duration, distance and spot landings.

Ted, our Fairview Park field instructor, does mostly the in-classroom flight instruction using his innovative hand-made RC simulator, a fly-by-wire RC U-control, quad copters, and soon a new laptop simulator provided by HSS. At the end of the classroom phase; Ted invites the students to orientation flights at Fairview Park. We expect all flyers present will extend a courteous welcome to our special guests.

A number of HSS outreach initiatives have been underway including new programs for the Costa Mesa's Downtown Teen Center, Girls Inc, and Rea Elementary School. Much more is in the "pipeline".

The Rea Elementary Program was initiated when John read a great article in January's Register supplement (The Current) about how Rea math and science teacher Mr. Aaron Harmon was teaching the engineering component of the new Common Core State Standards using small foam gliders. John contacted teacher Mr. Harmon, which lead to John and Ted doing a well received "show-and-tell" for the 500 students assembled for the weekly morning "Flag Deck' ceremony. The presentation was a preview of an HSS Design/Build/Fly program to be offered in conjunction with Mr. Harmon's Common Core classes.

Though out the following year, the Register will be specifically following Mr. Harmon's progress as an example of a local teacher implementing the Common Core Standards. Hopefully HSS will have made a positive contribution worth noting in the subsequent Register articles.

Our HSS program is a continuation and expansion of previous similar programs conducted for several years including Newport Sea Base and Costa Mesa's Whittier, Wilson, and Davis Elementary schools.

We thank the several HSS members who have already volunteered to help with the outreach program. The pressing current need is for more qualified flight instructors. We would also encourage the ladies to help out as with the Girl's Inc. program.

Costa Mesa Parks Commission Meeting, March 26, 2014

John Rittenhouse has taken upon himself the monumental task of following the gyrations of the Costa Mesa Parks Commission, and attempting to protect the HSS Use Agreement that is presently up for renewal. Our club officers are strongly supporting John. The following is Ted Broberg's minutes, followed by John's comments on the March 26 commission meeting. Thanks, John. - Ed.

Ted Broberg's notes. At tonight's meeting of the P and R Commission, we had five HSS members: Jesse Calleros, Jim Hanson, John Anderson, John Rittenhouse, and Ted Broberg. John A. led off with a summary of our work with local schools and UCI in model design and paper planes. Ted showed the dual-radio introductory instruction method with his SUPER CUB. A lady volunteer acted as a student pilot. The plane was tethered to an assembly stand, not to worry.

Jesse C. and John R. told about our wish for a five-year User Agreement. Community opinion was invited, and one local resident recommended for a one-year rather than a five-year arrangement. He cited noise and early and late flights, as well as high speeds observed at times as his concerns. Jesse and John R. told about our not having authority to "police" these infringements, and that calling the Park Ranger was the remedy. Jesse explained how club members are not the only fliers, and that we regularly urge compliance with the conditions the pilots agreed to when they were issued their Park Permits. We will continue to work to get more cooperation with those individuals who fly in ways not in harmony with the rules.

The Commission members all voiced support of our efforts. Chairman de Arakal moved that the language in paragraphs 6, 7, and 8 be re-worded in light of concerns of the Fish and Wildlife Department, and the issue was continued until further modifications were recommended by the City Staff and Commissioners. Pending the outcome of parties and regulating bodies, they appear to favor a renewal of the Use Agreement. See Editor's Comments at the end of this topic.

John Rittenhouse provided the following comments and observations. Additional comments by Jim Sonnenmeier are shown in italics within parentheses.

Thanks to all who attended last night's meeting, and special thanks to Ted for transcribing such detailed notes included above. I would like to supplement Ted's notes with my recollections...

Frankly I thought we were blindsided last night. According to the posted agenda, the intent was to renew our "Use Permit" with the city. The only variable was to be the exact duration, 1 year or 5 years. In fact, very little time was spent discussing the duration of the proposed renewal. As Ted conveyed, HSS members made their presentations to support our case for a five year renewal, after which I assumed a vote was to be taken. Contrary to the posted agenda, the chair (Byron de Arakal) stated that he had reservations concerning the wording of the existing "Use Permit" and that the existing agreement would have to be edited/updated prior to any vote on renewal! I don't consider any of the proposed changes favorable to us. I'm sure Ted and others have a better memory than I, however the following are representative of my recollection.

- 1. Our runway may be infringing on existing vernal ponds, and/or disturbing drainage/runoff of the local area. As such, a formal geographic measurement of our operations areas will be required.
- 2. The wording of stipulation #6 will be changed from: HSS shall grade, mow, weed and otherwise maintain the Site, to: The City shall grade, mow, weed and otherwise maintain the Site. (Jim S. suggests that this may not be changed unless the Feds introduce new rulings.)
- 3. The wording of stipulation #6 will be changed from: All such requests must be made in writing to the City of Costa Mesa's Public Services Department, Parks Project Manager, to: Are subject to the review by the Parks and Recreation Commission. (I interpreted this to mean that HSS will not be under the jurisdiction of Robert Staples). (Not necessarily, but the commission CORRECTLY wants the opportunity to approve stuff. The city has failed in its stewardship of the park, the Feds are pissed and the city wants to remedy this situation.)

Costa Mesa Parks Commission Meeting, March 26, 2014 (Continued)

- 4. The inclusion of a new paragraph between existing paragraphs 7 and 8. The language and intent is to give the Parks and Recreation Commission authority to immediately (temporarily) suspend our operations on an emergency basis for any reason of their choosing.
- 5. Stipulation #8 will be re-written requiring at least 45 days advanced noticed be given prior to HSS holding a "Special Event". There was also some vague talk about limiting our events to one day only, and maximum number of participants to 25 or less. (The reason for 45 days was very clear. There was NO talk of limiting an event to one day but rather change the language to "not more than two days." The current agreement limits the event to a max of 25 folks. Otherwise a special permit is required).

As mentioned before, these are my recollections of last night's events. I welcome any corrections and/or additions. At the conclusion of last night's meeting I did say that HSS would be happy to cooperate and collaborate in Commissions re-writing of our "Use Permit". I think the operative word is collaborate! We (HSS) need to be part of the process. To that end, I suggest the "Powers that Be" within the club promptly write the Commission a thank you email, and express our interest in being party to the re-write.

Editor's Comments: The conclusion by the Parks and Recreation Commission was that the basic "Use Permit" needed a major revision which has now been provided to us in draft form. It supposedly reflects inputs from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Department, but it is not clear that sufficient time has been allowed. While HSS officers requested the opportunity to participate in the revision process, it was done in a closed door environment. The results have been provided (April 17), and HSS comments are included in the following topic.

Draft Version of New HSS Use Permit

While HSS officers did not get to participate in the new Use Permit revisions, the end result has been provided to us in draft form for approval. John Rittenhouse is highly concerned, rightfully, as some of the changes are untenable. However, some of his concerns involve black text which is unchanged from previous Use Permits. The following five pages include the Use Permit with John's comments in the margins.

The change that is causing the greatest upset with HSS is the requirement for HSS to fully enforce the flying site rules on persons of which we have no authority. Back in 2006-2008 when Bill Eckles was the driving force for this agreement, the major accomplishment was obtaining Park Ranger support for handling rules violators. That rule was written into our Flying Site Rules as follows:

8.0 Regulations Enforcement. Members of the Harbor Soaring Site are empowered by the city of Costa Mesa to enforce these rules by requesting an offender cease inappropriate behavior. If the offender refuses to change his behavior, the HSS member will contact a Park Ranger who will cite the offender and secure his/her permit.

9.0 Emergencies. Who to contact.

Medical emergency or injury, crimes, rules violations and unauthorized activities:

Call 911 or Costa Mesa Police Communications 714-754-5252

Request Park Ranger. They will page the park ranger.

From inception (about 2007) to present, HSS members have been and will continue to be willing to enforce field rules to the extent they are legally authorized. We cannot site an offender. If the city were interested in deputizing our members (this is offered in jest), we would then be willing to completely enforce all rules as requested in the most recent Use Permit draft version. It is foolish for the city to force us to perform a task for which we have no authority. - Ed.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE HARBOR SOARING SOCIETY AND THE CITY OF COSTA MESA FOR THE USE OF A PORTION OF FAIRVIEW PARK

This User Agreement ("AGREEMENT") is by and between the City of Costa Mesa ("CITY"), a municipal corporation and public body, and the Harbor Soaring Society ("HSS"), a non-profit organization chartered by the Academy of Model Aeronautics ("AMA") and incorporated in the State of California.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, CITY is the owner of Fairview Park, a public park in the City of Costa Mesa; and

WHEREAS, HSS is committed to promoting and improving the enjoyment of model aircraft flying in Orange County, has determined that the use of Fairview Park would further this purpose, and desires for a portion of Fairview Park to be used for the flying of certain model aircraft; and

WHEREAS, the approved Fairview Park Master Plan allows for the flying of model aircraft and provides for model aircraft launching/landing sites at Fairview Park. NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and conditions herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. As used in this AGREEMENT, the term "model aircraft" means all forms of radio controlled gliders, electric motor gliders, and electric powered model airplanes and electric helicopters, but does NOT include internal combustion engine powered aircraft, rockets, and aircraft exceeding the AMA weight limit. No person shall be permitted to fly an internal combustion engine powered aircraft or rocket at Fairview Park. All model aircraft must comply with all applicable provisions of the AMA Safety Code and all other applicable AMA specifications and safety codes and as defined as a model aircraft by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).
- 2. CITY shall allow the taking off and landing of model aircraft in the area of Fairview Park marked "Silent Flyer Launch/Land Site (the "Site") on the City of Costa Mesa Fairview Park Master Plan attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by this reference. HSS use of the Site shall be nonexclusive. Model aircraft may only take off from and land in the Site. Model aircraft may be flown during posted hours. Model aircraft may be flown as far as unaided visual contact will allow, which means distance-wise from the pilot, as opposed to altitude. Membership in HSS shall not be required to fly model aircraft at Fairview Park, however HSS shall be responsible that all users of the site and their guests ("Flyers") comply with the requirements set forth herein.

- 3. HSS shall coordinate with CITY to install and maintain a Frequency Board at or near the Site and a system to post and monitor which potential frequencies may be used for remote control model aircraft operation and which frequencies are currently in use. All persons flying model aircraft at Fairview Park ("flyers") shall only use frequencies that are not already being used as demonstrated by the Frequency Board. Pilots shall only use radio-controlled frequencies allowed for model aircraft by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC).
- 4. HSS shall be responsible to ensure that all Flyers comply with 1) the Fairview Park rules posted; 2) the most recent version of HSS's "Fairview Park Flying Field Rules" ("HSS Flying Rules") (including the provision requiring an active AMA license for liability insurance purposes or proof of homeowner's or other type of liability insurance with a limit of no less than \$500,000 covering flying of model aircraft), which HSS shall keep posted at a kiosk next to the Canyon Drive parking lot entrance to the Site, and which are attached hereto as Exhibit "C" and incorporated herein by this reference; 3) all applicable sections of the AMA Safety Code and all other applicable AMA specifications and safety codes; 4) all applicable FAA regulations, guidelines, and advisory circulars; 5) all applicable sections of the Costa Mesa Municipal Code, and 6) this AGREEMENT. In particular, HSS acknowledges that FAA Advisory Circular 91-57 advises as a safety operating standard that model aircraft not be flown over 400 feet, and HSS affirms that Flyers shall not fly their model aircraft higher than 400 feet above ground level.
- 5. HSS shall also be responsible to ensure the following: All Flyers shall perform a "pre-flight check" on their model aircraft on the ground before they are flown in order to assure that all controls are working properly. Flyers shall not engage in combat flying at Fairview Park. Flyers shall take all actions necessary to avoid flying near other park users. Model aircraft are not be flown over residences, schools, or parking areas. Model aircraft remain clear of other aircraft at all times in a safe manner to the extent possible.
- 6. HSS shall grade, mow, weed, and otherwise maintain the Site. HSS may submit to CITY for consideration any proposals to make any modification to the Site, such as plantings, irrigation or modifications to buildings or grounds or any construction or improvements. All such requests must be made in writing to the City of Costa Mesa's Public Services Department, Parks Project Manager. Such modifications may be undertaken by HSS only with prior written approval of CITY, and Parks and recreation Commission. All such requests must be made in writing to the City of Costa Mesa's Public Services Department, Parks Project Manager, and are subject to review by the Costa Mesa Parks and Recreation Commission. Such modifications may be undertaken by HSS only with prior approval of the Costa Mesa Parks and shall conform to the approved Fairview Park Master Plan.

- 7 CITY shall provide HSS with no less than fourteen (14) days' notice in the event that a third party obtains a permit for an event at or in the vicinity of Fairview Park which model aircraft flying might disrupt or which might cause danger to the participants thereof. In response, HSS will postpone and reschedule any flying activity that might disrupt the event or endanger participants thereof, as determined by CITY. "CITY may at any time and without advance notice close the SITE to all flying activities in the event of an emergency or other circumstance which may pose an immediate threat to public health and safety or environmentally sensitive areas of Fairview Park."
- 8. "HSS shall have permission to hold scheduled events at Fairview Park, such as model aircraft competitions, which may occur over a period of not more than two days and which may include not more than 25 participants. HSS shall provide CITY with notice of such events at least forty-five (45) days prior to the event by electronic mail to the Parks and Recreation Manager. Notice of these events will be advertised in the HSS monthly newsletter and on the HSS kiosk at Fairview Park at least thirty (30) days prior to the event. For events involving 25 or more participants, a Special Events Permit Application must be obtained, filled out, and approved by CITY a minimum of 45 days prior to the start of the event. Applications may be obtained at City Hall.
- This AGREEMENT will commence as of the date in which the latter of CITY and HSS 9. approve and execute this AGREEMENT and will continue for a period of one (1) year, unless earlier terminated. Either party may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time, with or without cause, by providing 30 days' written notice of such termination to the other party. Upon or just prior to the expiration of the one-year term, this AGREEMENT may be considered for renewal by the Costa Mesa City Council, at the request of HSS, for an additional term, the length of which will be determined by the City Council. Termination or expiration of the Agreement will not relieve any individual member of the public from the insurance requirements referenced in Section 4 of this Agreement when utilizing Fairview Park for model aircraft purposes, provided that CITY allows such model aircraft activity. CITY may terminate this AGREEMENT, effective immediately upon notice to HSS, at any time, if HSS breaches this AGREEMENT in any way and/or if CITY determines that HSS'S use of Fairview Park creates a safety hazard. Upon termination of this AGREEMENT, HSS must remove all structures and improvements from the SITE under the supervision of the CITY within 30 days. The cost of removing said structures and improvements shall be the responsibility of HSS."
- 10. HSS may not assign or transfer any of its rights or duties hereunder, either in whole or inpart, in any manner whatsoever.
- 11. For the term of this AGREEMENT, HSS must submit annually to CITY, and maintain on file with CITY at all times, a valid certificate of liability insurance with insurance limits of no less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) Bodily Injury and Property Damage. Such insurance policy shall contain or be endorsed to contain the following provisions:

- A. Additional insureds: "The City of Costa Mesa and its elected and appointed boards, officers, agents, and employees are additional insureds with respect to this subject use and contract with City."
- B. Notice: "Said policy shall not terminate, nor shall it be cancelled, nor the coverage reduced, until thirty (30) days after written notice is given to City."
- C. Other insurance: "Any other insurance maintained by the City of Costa Mesa shall be excess and not contributing with the insurance provided by this policy."
- 12. Whenever possible, each provision of this AGREEMENT will be interpreted in such a manner as to be effective and valid under applicable law, but if any provision of this AGREEMENT is held by a court to be invalid under the applicable law, such provision will be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or invalidity, without invalidating the remainder of such provision, or the remaining provisions of this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT, and all documents attached hereto or made reference to and incorporated herein, constitutes the entire agreement between CITY and HSS to the subject matter of this AGREEMENT. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this AGREEMENT shall be valid unless made in writing and executed by both parties. This AGREEMENT is made and entered into in the State of California and the laws of said State will govern the validity and interpretation hereof and the performance hereunder by the parties herein. In the event of any legal action to enforce or interpret this AGREEMENT, the parties hereto agree that the sole and exclusive venue shall be a court of competent jurisdiction located in Orange County, California.
- 13. All notices, statements, demands, requests, consents, approvals, authorizations, appointments, or designations hereunder by either party to the other will be in writing and will be deemed given and served upon the other party, if delivered personally or three (3) days after depositing in the United States mail, postage prepaid, addressed to:



Be a Concerned Enthusiast – Support the AMA

As discussed in the April 2012 issue of Model Aviation (the AMA publication sent to all AMA members), the federal government has passed the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012, which includes Sec. 336 Special Rule for Model Aircraft. This law prevents the FAA from passing any rule that controls model aircraft being flown under the AMA safety code. This Act resulted in part by the 90,000+ letters written by AMA members to their representatives.

The AMA will shortly be facing a new FAA regulation called the "small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (sUAS) rule. In the next several months the FAA will post the preliminary regulation for public review. At this time the AMA will initiate a concerned citizens organization made up of AMA members to express their opinions of the preliminary regulation. To do this rapidly, the AMA will again contact all members by E-mail with instructions on comments and congressional contacts, which means the AMA needs everyone's current E-mail address. If you are not presently receiving occasional E-mail from the AMA, please go to www.modelaircraft.org and update your personal information. It is important for all of us to support the AMA especially in this endeavor.

2014 City Flying Permits Available Now

A permit to fly radio-controlled model aircraft is required to operate model aircraft at Fairview Park. You must also show proof of adequate liability insurance in the form of a current Academy of Model Aeronautics (AMA) membership card or a current homeowners/personal liability policy specifically covering model aircraft operation with a minimum limit of \$500,000. Rules and regulations for flying the model aircraft can be found in the City of Costa Mesa Municipal Code, Title 12, Chapter II, Articles 2 & 3.

Permit Fee: \$25 per year. Learner's Permit for youths 6-14 years old - \$15 per year.

WALK-IN Costa Mesa City Hall (77 Fair Drive, Costa Mesa 92626), 3rd Floor Recreation Counter Tuesday through Thursday from 8:00 AM – 4:30 PM (excluding City-observed holidays).

MAIL-IN Mail your renewal packet (see list below), to include full payment, to:

Recreation Division – Fly Permit City of Costa Mesa, P. O. Box 1200, Costa Mesa, CA 92628

Renewal Packet must include **ALL** of the following:

- Permit Application (filled out and signed).
- Copy of your drivers license.
- Copy of the AMA Membership Card (showing the required year) or homeowner's/personal liability insurance policy (specifically covering model airplane/aircraft flying with a minimum limit of \$500,000).
- Renewal Fee (\$25); payment by Check (payable to <u>City of Costa Mesa</u>) or charge to Credit Card (filled out and signed).

Note: Current permit holders with email addresses on file with the City will receive renewal packet information via email.

If you have questions or need additional information, please call the Recreation Division at (714) 754-5300.

Note that to fly at Fairview Park you need the above permit, liability insurance (preferably AMA), and you need to follow City of Costa Mesa Ordinance No. 07-01, City Regulations for Issuance, Suspension and Revocation of Permits to Fly at Fairview Park, Academy of Model Aeronautics Safety Code, and the Fairview Park Flying

AMA National Aeromodeling Heritage Program

Back in April of 2013, John Rittenhouse wrote a 22 page application to the Academy of Model Aeronautics to nominate the North Blimp Hangar at Tustin Marine Corps Air Station as a National Aeromodeling Heritage Site.

In October 2013 John was notified that AMA had accepted the proposal and that the North Hangar would be placed in the AMA Heritage Program. Several subsequent steps are required, including the preparation of a plaque, its formal installation at the hangar, and a public announcement. John has just reported the following project status.

I just received the following email from our friend Mr. Smith at the AMA. Over two years ago members of the Harbor Soaring Society embarked on a long term effort to have the MACS Tustin, North hangar recognized as a model aircraft, national historic site. We still have a long ways to go, but at last, our efforts are about to get some national recognition! We are continuing to regain access to the site, and will keep you advised on our efforts, as developments warrant.

The announcement that the Tustin Blimp Hangar was selected as a historic site will be appearing in the May 2014 issue of *Model Aviation* magazine, on page 11.

This progress was only slightly interrupted by the collapse of a small portion of the hangar roof several months ago. While status on the hangar and the proposed 83 acre public park is limited, it is understood that the US Navy (who presently holds title to the property) is intending to repair the damage before transferring the property to the Orange County Parks Department and the City of Tustin.




